

Facilities Management – Director Skip Camp The department is responsible for the security, repair, and systematic maintenance of 660 county buildings and structures that include more than three million square feet of space.

Fleet Management – Director Dan Croft
The department provides centralized maintenance
of the county fleet of motor vehicles. Annually, staff
completes more than 8,500 maintenance and repair
work orders, maintains the county's fuel system and
dispenses more than 1.3 million gallons of fuel each
year to both internal and external agencies.

Human Resources – Director Jean Merritt
Designated a Family Friendly Business by the Naples
Alliance for Children, the Human Resources Department has taken steps to improve the personal growth opportunities and job satisfaction for employees, with a focus on the value of maintaining a competitive compensation and benefits package, while creating an organizational climate that challenges employees to better levels of performance.

Information Technology – Director Barry Axelrod Staff provides the backbone data services including e-mail, internet access, desktop support and Intranet services for over 1,500 computer users; manages and

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safeguards all county databases; and assists internal customers in developing and executing business continuity and disaster recovery plans for their technology systems.

Purchasing Department – Director Steve Carnell Staff facilitates the open competitive procurement of commodities and services in the most cost efficient manner possible on behalf of, and in conjunction with, other county agencies, as well as manages the county's purchasing card program and the transfer and disposition of surplus county property.

Records Management – Manager Michael Cox Designed as a guideline for county employees to adhere to when making filing decisions, the program addresses three key issues: 1) Assuring compliance with the State of Florida Public Records laws and Florida Administrative Code; 2) Improving customer service by providing the right documents to the right people at the right time and 3) Reducing costs by eliminating unnecessary storage of paper documents.

Risk Management – Director Jeff Walker

The department is responsible for the identification, measurement and treatment of potential risk of loss to county assets, and manages a Subrogation Recovery Program designed to pursue and collect monies owed to the county due to damages caused by third parties. In December, 2006 the department opened an on-site primary care clinic to effectively address the healthcare needs of employees.

Conservation Collier Manager Alexandra Sulecki

Conservation Collier is a willing-seller, taxpayer-funded conservation land acquisition program initiated by voters in a November 2002, county-wide referendum and subsequently affirmed in a November 2006 referendum. Program goals are to acquire, protect, restore and manage environmentally sensitive lands within Collier County for the benefit of present and future generations.

Grant Services Coordinator Marlene Foord

Staff manages a centralized grant acquisition program and provides guidance for proper grant management and compliance with state, federal and local and grantor requirements. The goal of the grant acquisition initiative is to reduce the cost of providing the public with services, facilities and infrastructure by maximizing the use of federal, state, and local grants.

Real Estate Services – Manager Toni Mott
Part of Facilities Management, the Real Estate
section is responsible for securing land and land
rights for the construction of county infrastructure and supporting facilities. Additional responsibilities include insuring that the property
appraisal program operates within the requirements of Florida Statutes, managing the Lake
Trafford Memorial Gardens Cemetery, the sale
of lands in Golden Gate Estates pursuant to the
1983 Agreement with Avatar Properties Inc., and
administering the funds derived from the sale of
the lands
