- A. The meeting was called to order by Chairman John Ribes at 2:07 P.M. A quorum was established.
- B. The Pledge of Allegiance and Invocation was given by Chairman John Ribes.
- C. Approval of Agenda

Mr. Olesky moved to approve the Agenda. Seconded by Ms. Geroy. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

D. Approval of May 16, 2007 Meeting Minutes

Mr. Olesky moved to approve the May 16, 2007 meeting minutes. Seconded by Mr. Zino. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

- E. New Business
 - 1) Director's Highlights -Barry Williams, Director, Parks & Recreation Mr. Williams reported as follows:
 - Tax reform will impact Parks & Recreation as Parks & Recreation is heavily subsidized by ad valorem taxes
 - Suggested spending cuts will be discussed at the next Collier County Board of County Commissioners meeting and the Board of County Commissioners will make the final decision on the spending cuts
 - Expenses must be cut and suggestions for doing so were as follows: Sun & Fun hours could be cut during winter months; a hiring freeze could be implemented and overtime eliminated; hours in community centers could be reduced; job bank employees could be used only when a fee is being charged
 - Possible means of increasing revenue would be to increase the cost of an annual beach pass and an overall fee increase of 10% could be imposed on all activities currently being charged for
 - Not filling open positions does put a strain on the current employees
 - Manatee Park conceptual plan is being worked on, quotes are being obtained, plans will go before the Board of County Commissioners in September
 - Summer camp has 1,300 participants signed up
 - 2) Introduction of New Advisory Board Members Barry Williams Mr. Williams introduced the new Parks and Recreation Advisory Board members, Bart Zino and Barbara Buehler. Chairman Ribes welcomed them.
 - 3) Employee Recognition of Ellen Barkin Barry Williams
 Chairman Ribes presented Ellen Barkin with a plaque in recognition of her efforts in saving the life of a Collier County citizen.

4) Online Registration/Website Presentation - Paul Ducca, Collier County Information Technology Department

Mr. Ducca gave a PowerPoint presentation on the CLASS program.

- CLASS would allow people to sign up for Parks and Recreation programs and renew memberships from home
- CLASS system would save Collier County money
- A secure website would be provided through encryption
- Customer would pay a transaction fee for the service
- Mr. Ducca requested a recommendation from the Advisory Board to move forward on the project

Discussion ensued as follows:

Mr. Ribes commented that the program would provide convenience to the public, usage would be voluntary and the transaction fee would be reasonable.

Mr. Zino commented that minimum usage might not be met in the off-season, and it is not desirable for Collier County to handle credit cards.

Mr. Olesky moved that the internet registration and payment program be approved with the convenience fees for said transactions to be passed on to the customer. Seconded by Mr. Zino. Motion carried unanimously 5-0.

Mr. Williams introduced Illonka Washburn, Operations Manager, to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board.

Chairman Ribes welcomed Ms. Washburn.

5) 2007 Food Grant Presentation - Jim Thomas

Mr. Thomas gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Summer Food Service Program for Children.

- Collier County would be reimbursed based on the number of meals served
- Meals are delivered by truck
- Number of meals estimated for 2007 is 150,000
- Program has received many awards
- Site is only site permitted to serve hot food
- Increase in usage of the program is due to discovering new area to serve
- 6) July is Parks and Recreation Recognition Month Barry Williams Mr. Williams stated Parks and Recreation Recognition month would be celebrated with an ice cream social on July 26, 2007.
- F. Old Business

Little League Complex - Barry Williams

Mr. Williams discussed efforts to organize the new little league complex.

G. Recreation Highlights
OHV Park Temporary Site - Murdo Smith

Mr. Smith gave a PowerPoint presentation regarding the Off-Highway Vehicle Park.

- Wetlands will be protected with a saltation fence and bales of hay
- Protecting wetlands would be largest expense
- Property is being leased to South Florida Water Management District
- Park will be 150 acres and open to the public on scheduled weekends
- Three part-time park rangers will be on duty 12 hours per day with a ranger stationed at the gate
- Park will only accommodate ATVs
- Amenities will include portable toilets, a helicopter landing pad for use in case of emergencies, parking for 100 to 125 vehicles and trailers
- Riders would be required to obtain a permit prior to using the park
- DOT-approved helmets and safety equipment would be required
- Rangers would have ATVs and a sports-utility vehicle
- South Florida Water management is going to provide \$75,000 for the start-up operation
- Area must be restored when the lease is up
- Fee of \$5 to \$10 per day per vehicle is being considered
- Fish and Game Commission would provide policing

H. Capital Project Highlight

Caxambas Marina - Ray Carter

Mr. Carter provided a PowerPoint presentation regarding construction of the new park fuel installation.

- New tank is located away from the old tank
- Diesel and gasoline fuel will be available
- Inspection will be performed around the old tank to determine if there are any contaminants
- Cost of the new system is \$199,814 with the contract being awarded to Mactec Environmental and Engineering Service. PMI is the subcontractor
- Fuel tank would hold 5,000 gallons on each side
- New landscaping buffer is to be planted between Eagle Cay and the park
- A third floating dock 12x64, ADA accessible, is currently in design and being permitted
- Green space and a picnic area is planned in the area of the old tank pit
- Possibility of installing a second tank in order to better accommodate larger boats could be considered but the current system would be able to accommodate the larger boats
