*This **ROAD ALERT** was prepared by the Collier County Growth Management Division to inform the community about scheduled road construction and road maintenance projects along major roadways in Collier County where lane closures are planned or traffic flow may be affected.*

COLLIER COUNTY CONSTRUCTION/MAINTENANCE PROJECTS:

***SPECIAL ADVISORY* - Livingston Road Closures – On Sunday, Nov. 7, Livingston Road northbound beginning at Vanderbilt Beach Road will be CLOSED and also the intersections of Immokalee Road and Livingston Road will be CLOSED in all directions** beginning at approximately 11 a.m. and continuing for approximately 15 to 30 minutes as Collier County Sheriff's Deputies escort a contingent of motorcyclists riding for the March of Dimes Bikers for Babies event. The bikers will leave the North Collier Regional Park on Livingston Road at approximately 11 a.m. and travel north to Bonita Beach Road where they will turn west to continue the ride. Deputies expect to reopen each intersection along the route as soon as the motorcycles have cleared the location. **MOTORISTS MAY WISH TO TAKE AN ALTERNATE ROUTE DURING THIS TIME PERIOD.**

Airport-Pulling Road and North Road Intersection – At the intersection of Airport-Pulling Road and North Road expect intermittent lane closures in all directions **OVERNIGHT FROM 7 P.M. TO 7 A.M** to continue for approximately one week., weather permitting, as crews refurbish the mast arms. Lighted arrow boards, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist travelers driving through the area.

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Brookside Drive between Davis Boulevard and Sunset Lane – On Brookside Drive between Davis Boulevard and Sunset Lane, traffic will continue to be reduced from two lanes to **ONE LANE ONLY** for approximately three weeks from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., weather permitting, as crews install drainage pipe as part of the construction for the Gateway Triangle Stormwater Improvement Project. Flagmen, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist drivers traveling through the area.

Immokalee Road between Camp Keais Road and 40th Street N.E. – On Immokalee Road between Camp Keais Road and 40th Street N.E. expect traffic to continue to be reduced to **ONE LANE ONLY** for approximately one month from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., weather permitting, as crews construct paved shoulders on both sides of the roadway. Flagmen, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist drivers traveling through the area.

Immokalee Road and Everglades Boulevard Intersection – On Immokalee Road at the intersection of Everglades Boulevard expect traffic to continue to be reduced to **ONE LANE ONLY** for approximately three weeks from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., weather permitting, as crews build a westbound left turn lane. In addition, on Everglades Boulevard at the same intersection expect traffic to be reduced to **ONE LANE ONLY** during the same time period, weather permitting, as crews build an eastbound right turn lane. Flagmen, lighted arrow boards, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist travelers driving through the area.

Kirkwood Avenue between Commercial Drive and Avondale Street – On Kirkwood Avenue between Commercial Drive and Avondale Street expect traffic to continue to be reduced to **ONE LANE ONLY** for approximately three weeks from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., weather permitting, as crews install stormwater pipes. Flagmen, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist drivers traveling through the area.

Linwood Avenue between Pine Street and Commercial Drive – On Linwood Avenue between Pine Street and Commercial Drive expect traffic to continue to be reduced to **ONE LANE ONLY** for approximately three weeks from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m., weather permitting, as crews rebuild the roadway. Flagmen, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist motorists traveling through the area.

Oil Well Road near Ave Maria Boulevard – On Oil Well Road in the vicinity of Ave Maria Boulevard the speed limit has been reduced to 35 mph for approximately two months as crews from the Oil Well Road Construction Project work on widening the roadway. Electronic message signs, lighted arrow boards, advance warning signs and barricades are being used to assist motorists traveling in this area.

Radio Road between Livingston Road and Airport-Pulling Road – On Radio Road between Livingston Road and Airport-Pulling Road expect both eastbound and westbound intermittent lane closures to continue for approximately one month from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., weather permitting, as crews install irrigation and landscape. Lighted arrow boards, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist drivers traveling through the area.

Vanderbilt Beach Road between Bay Laurel Boulevard and Airport-Pulling Road – On Vanderbilt Beach Road between Bay Laurel Boulevard and Airport-Pulling Road expect both eastbound and westbound intermittent lane closures to continue for approximately one week from 7:30 a.m. to 5 p.m., weather permitting, as crews construct intersection and roadway improvements. Flagmen, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist drivers traveling through the area.

WORK BY OTHERS:

Goodlette-Frank Road between 7th Avenue North and 13th Avenue North – On Goodlette-Frank Road between 7th Avenue North and 14th Avenue North expect southbound traffic to be diverted from three lanes to two lanes on Tuesday, Nov. 9 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m., weather permitting, as crews from the City of Naples repair a valve box. Lighted arrow boards, advance warning signs and barricades will be used to assist motorists traveling through the area.

S.S. Judge Jolley Bridge on S.R. 951 between Capri Boulevard and Marco Island – Work is underway to construct the new parallel two lane bridge to Marco Island. Traffic has been shifted to the west near Marco Island Yacht Club entrance to allow crews to perform work on the east side of the bridge approach to Marco Island. Access to the Marco Island Yacht Club is maintained. Motorists are advised to use caution driving in the construction zone. The contractor is Johnson Bros.

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
