## I-75/Everglades Boulevard Update Public Information Comments

**1.)** Yes I want the exit. I go to college, so it will be less miles.

**2.)** Yes, I want the exit. Because if I need to go to town, I don't want to go around and won't go to Miami. It's closer to the hospital so I want the improvement.

**3.)** I want the exit. Because if I have an emergency and this will be closer to the hospital. I have 3 sons who go to college and is much closer for them for my family when they come to see me from Miami.

**4.)** Consideration should be given now to placing the interchange at the southern terminus of the planned Wilson Boulevard Extension. Few if any homes would need to be condemned as compared to Everglades Boulevard. Local environmental groups support construction of Wilson Boulevard and might be supportive of moving the interchange further west from the panther refuge. Large landowners in North Belle Meade could help with the interchange access lands and costs. If any interchange could be approved without strong environmental objections, it would be at Wilson Boulevard.

5.) I agree that it will benefit all who live near I-75.

- 6.) Needed for safety reasons; I believe are very obvious. Build it now.
- 7.) I think it looks great. Get it done.

8.) I am the Team Leader of the Golden Gate CERT Team (Citizen Emergency Response Team) Association of Golden Gate Fire District. In 2009 there was a major woods fire that closed both Golden Gate Boulevard and Everglades Boulevard. Residents were at the mercy of the winds and fire-trapped. This is a matter of public safety. It has been needed for years-red tape. Life is more important that red tape! Evacuation is the first priority-thank God we have a great fire service. But it really could have been a fire with loss of life. Build this interchange.

**9.)** The safety of my family (3 kids, wife and my father) is a huge concern to me, we had a fire last summer, in less than 1/2 hour went from S.E. 22 Ave to 18 Ave. I could have lost my whole family because of lack of access to the estates for the fire dept, etc. or a quick way out of it. It takes us 39 minutes to get to I-75 and Everglades today, with a ramp on place it will take us 3 minutes. It will save money, gas time and the environment. My kids can't apply for a part-time job in Naples because they have to drive 45 minutes to get there, making it cost effective to work there it will only be 9 minutes both ways. To get to I-75 and 951 (my work) I spent 25 minutes today, it will be 4 minutes by the ramp; to get to Miami is a waste of time and money and gas because of the driving distance. It will cut more than 1/2 the time by the ramp now.

**10.)** This project will also impact our pockets. Because we will save gas, the car would suffer less. And best of all we don't have to wake up so early to go to work. God Bless and thank you.

**11.)** No taxes for Jackson Lab and NO lab to pollute the Estates. Open I-75 and Everglades.

12.) Stop the politics and open I-75 and Everglades ASAP!

**13.)** I am for the ramps. It takes me from 4 a.m. that I get up to make it to work at 6:30 a.m. because there is no ramp at Everglades. Also when we had the big fire, I had everything burn that meant no easy access for the fire department to reach back where I live.

14.) This interchange is necessary and will enhance public safety and welfare. While the environment is important, opening this connection will not have a significant impact on wetlands on species habitat. Consider if the interchange is not built, homes will still be built and many cars will still travel Everglades Boulevard. Unless we are going to "take" most of the un-built property, build out will necessitate a connection of 150,000 population neighborhood to I-75.

**15.)** I'm for the project. The sooner the better for safety reasons.

**16.)** This is a very important project for all Golden Gate citizens. It should have been included in the original I-75 plans.

**17.)** I have waited too long for this exit. Years ago before I-75, I was able to cross S.R. 84-Alligator Alley at will. We always had access to north and south of Alligator Alley, S.R. 84. I love the outdoors and the animals and nature and would never want them to be destroyed. But I have had fires and safety problems. And those emergency vehicles took too long to come to my property. I say this as a safety for humans issue and not an environment issue. We need this exit now, not later.

**18.)** I am very pleased to hear an exit will be placed on I-75 at Everglades Boulevard. There used to be an exit there years ago and now there is nothing there. I have to go drive an extra 50 miles off exit 29 just to get to my property off Desoto Boulevard. We need this exit to save lives, time, money and welcome for our people. These are factors we can't forget about. Those are our basic human rights. Thanks for your time.

**19.)** Please, please get this interchange for the welfare of all. I have lived out on Desoto for 20 years and was told that at the time that an interchange was in the works - the possibility of harm from wildfires or other emergency that requires evacuation is very real. I have experienced as showers raining down on the Boulevard and no way to evacuate. I think the possibility of a class action law suit for property damage and or loss of life resulting from no evacuation route, due to this project not going through will occur. This is very important. I will now allow human life to be in jeopardy for environmental reasons that are political when this project could be constructed for the benefit of both people and environment.

I lived through the 60,000 acre fire in 2007. The fire swept through my property with a fury. My home was saved-but not my neighbors. This too was a wake up call. Now imagine a catastrophe in the Picayune State Forest the demanded immediate evacuation-imagine fallen trees on Everglades Boulevard. Gates are closed at I-75-where do we go? How will you get to save us? Rescue us, trust the wounded when every second and minute counts? We are dignified hard working citizens who deserved the safety other citizens are afforded.

**26.)** Golden Gate Estates area property owners need to be accurately informed about potential impact to their properties and the traffic implications on Everglades Boulevard from future developments in the rural lands stewardship areas. Pep rallies are fine and dandy but the public information process on this project to date has been embarrassingly short on facts and substance. Lots of rah rah and no facts. I am highly opposed to the construction of this interchange. The commissioners and public are not worried about public safety, they are concerned with the convenience that would exist after the interchange. Don't candy-coat the reasons. Please do not go through with this!!!!
