"To Improve and expand the current level of EMS service utilizing existing resources and level of funding"

Emergency Medical Services Blue Ribbon Committee

- The committee focused their system evaluation on two (2) successful models.
 - Broward Sheriffs Office Fire and Rescue Department & City of Fort Lauderdale Fire Rescue "This system is composed of 17 fire and rescue agencies and 3 private COPCN ALS providers totaling 343 units"
 - Seattle Fire Department Medic One /King County EMS " 6 ALS transport provider and over 80 BLS transport units"
- Both Models are Fire Based delivery systems.
- BRC provided fourteen (14) recommendations

Four of the Fourteen BRC

- Develop a Public Safety Authority (PSA)
- Establish a two-tier BLS ALS System
- Mandate that all agencies providing ALS services also provide patient transport to the hospitals
- Encourage pilot project aimed at a functional integration of County EMS personnel into the fire district

The Concept Proposal

- To allow the City of Naples, City of Marco Island and the North Naples Fire Control & Rescue District to provide ALS transport services within their respective municipal and district boundaries.
- Our proposal mirrors the Seattle Fire Based EMS model.
 - Collier County government will contract ("Certificate of Service")
 with the City of Naples, City of Marco Island and the North Naples
 Fire Control District to provide ALS transport services within their
 respective municipal and district boundaries.
 - The contract will be on a per unit cost basis
 - The county will continue to collect the county-wide ad valorem fee and transport unit fees.
 - The county will continue to provide ALS transport and Helicopter services to all other areas in the county.

 - Current Ambulance transport fees:*\$2.3 million
 (3 year average)
 - Total *\$4.8 million
- Proposal
- 3-ALS transport units:
 - \$900,000 per unit: Total *\$2.7 million
- Funds remaining to support county-wide infrastructure: (i.e. Medflight one, Office of the Medical Director, Mutual Aides, EMS services to unincorporated areas)

- City of Marco Island:
 - Current City tax dollar subsidy: *\$ 1.48 million
 (equivalent .18 mil)
 - Current Ambulance transport fees: *\$ 655 thousand
 (3 year average)
 - Total *\$ 2.1 million
- Proposal
- 2-ALS transport units:
 - *\$900,000 per unit: Total *\$1.8 million
- Funds remaining to support county-wide infrastructure: (i.e. Medflight one, Office of the Medical Director, Mutual Aides, EMS services to unincorporated areas)


Benefits


- Implement BRC recommendation of adopting a model similar to Seattle
- Adopt Public Safety Authority
- Create an EMS Foundation
- Current EMS EMT and Paramedics will have first right of refusal for positions.
- Adopt Blue Ribbon Recommendation of integrating existing EMS into the fire departments.
- Immediate improvement in the current utilization of both physical (units) and human (personnel) resources in both the urban and rural service areas:
 - Improve resource allocation and accountability "ability to manage all available resources"
 - Avoid the duplication of service "Does a fire apparatus need to respond to every medical emergency?" – NO!
 - Improve the ability to respond to concurrent 911 calls for service.
 - Additional monies to improve level of service to other districts which are currently being under-served

Benefits (cont.)

- Reduce System Cost
 - Implementation of FLSA 7(k) for Firefighter/Paramedic Certified personnel transferred to fire department
 - More cost effective utilization of personnel
- Enhance the Office of the Medical Director (OMD)
 - Unification of county medical training personnel.
 - Increasing quality and amount of educational opportunities
 - Single tiered medical protocol regardless of jurisdiction
