

INITIAL SUBMITTAL REQUIREMENTS

UTILITY SHED PERMIT

- Permit Application:
- Owner/Builder Affidavit: Required when owner is obtaining permit
- Notice of Commencement: A certified copy is required if job value is greater than \$2,500 prior to the first inspection (this is not required to be submitted to obtain the permit).

Residential Sheds: Provide plans listed below:

- Certified Site Plan: Not older than 6 months, signed and sealed by a licensed Florida professional surveyor and mapper, architect or engineer, showing property lines, setbacks, easements, water bodies, and all existing and proposed structures.
 - If proposed shed is 400 sq. ft. or less of new impervious area, and all requirements of Bulletin 21 are met, site plan does not need to be signed and sealed.

 - If proposed shed is 200 sq. ft. or less, a Spot Survey Waiver may be used. If being used for animals, show that shed is at least 100 feet from neighboring dwellings.
 - If on septic/well, show the location of well, septic, and drainfield in relation to proposed structure. Provide a floor plan of proposed structure.

■ Construction Drawings:

- For Onsite Construction: Signed and Sealed, if applicable, by an Architect or registered P.E., to the current building code.
- For Prefabricated Sheds: Documents approved by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity
 - Must comply with the Florida Building Code wind load requirements.
- Product Approvals: Florida Product Approvals or Miami-Dade NOAs are required for all windows, doors, shutters, roofing materials, underlayment, roof vents, etc.
 - One Index sheet with each permit set
 - One separate set which includes an index sheet, coversheet and installation instructions for proposed building materials.
- Vegetation Removal Affidavit: Required if lot is one acre or greater.
 - One acre of vegetation is allowed to be removed after the single-family building permit has been issued. A Vegetation Removal Permit is required to clear over one acre.
- Stormwater Plan: Required for 1 & 2 Family properties that do not have a South Florida Water Management District Permit, Surface Water Management Permit or Environmental Resource Permit (most zoning that is not in a PUD).

Commercial Sheds: Provide plans listed below:

- Construction Drawings:
 - For Onsite Construction: Signed and Sealed, if applicable, by an Architect or registered P.E., to the current building code.
 - For Prefabricated Sheds: Documents approved by the Florida Department of Economic Opportunity
 - Must comply with the Florida Building Code wind load requirements.
- SDP (Site Development Plan): The approved SDP, including the cover page, site plans, and architectural plans, if required.

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
