DRAINAGE PERMITTING

- 1. We are primarily interested in property adjacent (touching) to FDOT right-of-way or easement.
- 2. Always submit four (4) copies of the completed Permit Application Form 592-12 and Drainage Permit Form 592-13 with the required attachments.
- 3. All copies of Permit Application Form 592-12 and Drainage Permit Form 592-13 <u>must</u> have original signatures of the applicant (copies are not acceptable).
- 4. All submitted drawings and calculations must be signed, dated and sealed by a Florida Professional Engineer. **Plans are to be on 11" x 17" sheets.**
- 5. If a site requires both a Driveway Connection Permit and a Drainage Permit (form 592-13), we will not issue the Driveway Permit until all drainage matters have been satisfied.
- 6. If a site drains to F.D.O.T. R/W before development, we will take their runoff after development. However, if a site does not drain to F.D.O.T. R/W before development, we will not accept their runoff after development.
- 7. **REMEMBER-** If the property drains to F.D.O.T. R/W you need a permit. If it does not drain to the F.D.O.T. R/W, they get an exemption.
- 8. All drainage permits must be certified by a registered Florida P.E. for a final acceptance by the FDOT when construction of the project is complete.
- 9. To complete your application **you must submit four (4) copies of each** of the following items:
