

REVISIONS

Any changes made to the plans of a building permit must submit a revision. A building permit revision allows you to submit plan changes to an issued construction, demolition, mechanical, or site work permit. There are two types of revisions: Major and Minor.

Major and Minor Revisions

A major revision requires you to <u>cancel the permit</u> and then reapply for a new permit. Examples of major revisions:

- Substantial changes in the scale of the structure
- Substantial changes in the structural design.
- Type of construction changes
- Changes in occupancy that require extensive changes to the construction and life safety design of the structure
- Moving the structure on the site, resulting in a totally new layout
- A totally new design

Revisions that don't meet the criteria above are considered minor. You can receive approval for minor revisions by completing the <u>Revision Form.</u>

Submitting a Revision

You can submit revisions as long as the permit has been issued, and as long as it has not expired or been finaled.

- 1. Complete the <u>Revision Form</u>
- 2. Revisions to the plans must be "Clouded" with an itemized list of the scope of work
- 3. The same amount of plans from the first submittal must be submitted again.
 - 4. <u>Standard Review Times</u> will apply.
