Disaster Recovery Centers Will Open for Sunday Only In Collier County

ORLANDO, Fla. – Federal officials announced that two Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs) will be open in Collier County to assist Hurricane Irma survivors for one day only on **Sunday, December 3.**

These Disaster Recovery Centers offer in-person support to individuals and small business owners, especially those who work weekends and have therefore been unable to get to a DRC. They will be located in Immokalee and Everglades City, and **hours will be noon to 5:00 p.m.**

Recovery specialists from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and the State of Florida will be available to provide assistance to anyone inquiring about their applications, learning about the appeals process or updating their status.

You may have other needs while visiting a DRC:

- If you have a disability and require a reasonable accommodation, please see a DRC manager when you arrive.
- Language translations are offered through Telephonic Interpretation Services in 200 languages.

FEMA's temporary housing assistance and grants for public transportation expenses, medical and dental expenses, and funeral and burial expenses do not require individuals to apply for an SBA loan. However, applicants who receive SBA loan applications must submit them to SBA to be eligible for assistance that covers personal property, vehicle repair or replacement, and moving and storage expenses.
