**Operation Lasting Hope  
Financial Limitations  
Maximum Benefit \$1,000 Per Household**

**To receive assistance, households will need to provide proof of disaster-related damage.**

Proof of damage/loss may consist of a FEMA Assessment Report, an insurance damage report, loss verification report, settlement letter, letter from landlord listing the damage to your personal property if you're a renter, letter of denial or proof of loss statement. The documentation provided must show a loss to personal property to qualify. For automobile repairs, you will need a valid quote from a qualified service provider that indicates:

- a. The nature of the service(s) needed
- b. The cost of the service(s) and
- c. Written verification from the service provider that the damage is the result of the disaster.

**Households may receive assistance once in the first phase of the disaster response.** The total amount of combined assistance provided to any one household may not exceed \$1,000 per household. **Checks or cash will not be paid directly to the survivor.** Only one application per household will be considered. An individual may not apply on behalf of two or more households. Also, the following limits apply to the following types of assistance:
