PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

December 2017

GGEACA Members, MERRY CHRISTMAS!

We have been busy this month with meetings about the Vanderbilt Beach Rd Extension Design. Attended the Board of County Commissioners meet on 12 Dec along with 11 residents who spoke to the issue. The effort resulted in guidelines to the design contractor being changed to now evaluate 3 alternatives:

- 1. Design for all 8 streets to be connected,
- 2. Design for limited or select streets to be connected.
- 3. Design for None of the streets to be connected.

These 3 alternatives along with associated costs will be brought back to the BCC before a decision is made on the design. And residents will be included in information meetings as the design progresses.

We met with North Collier Fire District. After breaking their Merger Promises and raising our taxes, they want more money by proposing a Fire Service Fee - in addition to the annual tax. They are terrible business managers. Raising taxes hides management's incompetence.

As to the 1 cent sales tax it is progressing ahead to a 2018 . Again, government cannot get enough money from the taxpayer. More to come on this.

Also, Conservation Collier has removed itself from the 1 cent sales tax proposal. Again, this group wants more money to create more future debt. And it does not return anything usable to the Estates resident. This proposal is guaranteed to remove money from your pocket every Christmas.

FYI, the Catholic Church has purchased 41 acres on the southwest side of Wilson Blvd at Immokalee Rd. They plan to not use the Estates Roads, but only have an driveway on Immokalee Rd. It will take a couple of years as they go through the process, but there will probably be a traffic signal between Wilson Blvd and the Charter School

On the bright side the Sheriff's Office has acquired a new Bell UH-1H helicopter. It also can be used in wildfires with a water bucket. This is a good purchase. Estates residents are now not as dependent on the Florida Forestry Service and the Fire Districts to protect our homes. We will try to get the new helicopter to visit the Estates.

Last Month's GGEACA Meeting Notes:

Our November 21 meeting featured Kris VenLengen brought us perspectives of the white paper outlining community planning changes as part of the Golden Gate Area Master Plan growth management plan re-study. He reviewed highlights from the white paper related to the Rural Estates, and heard some further insights and perspectives from the audience. GGEACA has been active in participating in the Re-Study workshops and surveys, and provided community perspectives in the form of recommendations to be incorporated into the RE-Study effort. Commissioner Bill McDaniel and Deputy County Manager Nick Casalanguida were also in attendance.

On November 13 a special community meeting was hosted by GGEACA to address Vanderbilt Beach Road **Extension re-start of design of the road.** The major concern was the design of the road, and specifically, how all the residents would be affected by connector/collector roads being created to connect Golden Gate Blvd and VBR Extension at 27th NW, 25th NW, 23rd NW, 21st NW, 19th NW, 17th NW, 15th NW, and 13th NW. A concept of a limited access frontage road was made by one resident, and Deputy County Manager said that was an interesting idea that might be something to be considered. He was going to look into it and have staff evaluate it. At the BCC Meeting on December 12, County Commissioners, in consideration of the restart of the design and engineering for the VBR Project, 11 neighbors presented their concerns to the Commissioners, and the Commissioners were favorable to the residents' concerns to keep the dead-end roads as they are. County staff was still asked to bring forward the analysis for three options as proposed by staff – no connections to VBR, limited access frontage road, and full access (all streets) to VBR. As the cleanup continues, piles of dead debris brought down by the storm on many unimproved lots in the Estates area will go unnoticed, and untended to. The wildfire risk will be elevated for the coming season. We need to be prepared.

education, resources and mitigation for wildfire hazards. Maintenance of firebreaks, new fire breaks and wildfire fighting resources are being planned with this funding. As harsh and as intense as last year's wildfire season was, the hurricane and the volume of debris in the wooded wildlands lots throughout the estates, means a greater risk is at hand. Partnering agencies will work together to help reduce the risk of wildfires through mitigation efforts, to improve home safety with increased education, to increase accessibility to resources which aid in wildfire reduction, and to provide clear communication throughout the community. No matter how you feel about the joy of the holidays, stress - whether positive or negative - is a part of it. Stress can result from many things - yearning to be with family and or friends, but can't because of distance of finances; a rift or death in the family can evoke dread and sadness.

Creating those festivities is work; planning, cleaning, organizing, decorating, and cooking for those valued guests can be overwhelming! How can you keep yourself from becoming unraveled?

First, always take care of yourself! You know that you cannot take care of



others until you have taken care of yourself. If you are tired, hungry or disorganized you may react badly to the most mundane circumstance. You need to fuel, so eat - but eat well, not just healthy. Enjoy that glass of wine and savor your favorite food in moderation. But don't beat yourself up if you overindulge. Adjust for the rest of the day or the next day. Go t 10 minutes to kill? Exercise - but make it fun! Ask a friend or family member to go for a walk. Studies show that just being outdoors in the green is calming! An alternative is dancing - dance in the kitchen while preparing a meal or shuffle the furniture around and get the whole family on the floor. Exercise reduces stress and is as effective as antidepressant. It releases endorphins - the body feel-good hormones! Schedule a reward at the end of a stressful event (i.e.: massage, warm bubble bath.)

Second, plan but keep it simple! So be good to yourself! My best recommendation is to take that 15 minutes to a half hour and plan - it will save you time, money, and your sanity! If I skip this step I become a disorganized mess, anxiety rears its ugly head and inevitably is self-fulfilling. On a calendar, put in all of your meetings, parties and events for the next month at least. Then write the things you need for each event on either a separate piece of paper or your note application on your phone (This prevents me from forgetting my list.) As you move from work to an event, you can use any extra time to handle those errands to gather those things you need including birthday and



holiday gifts.

Lastly keep it simple. Decorations really look more elegant and well planned when you take the time to think. Choose a color theme - maybe all you do is set out poinsettias! Or a Christmas tree with a manger –isn't that the real reason for the holiday? Focus on gratitude instead of perfection. Share quality time with family and friends and appreciate what you have! Order take out - enjoy a stress free meal at home by the tree. Make it a family affair: have your family be a part of holiday preparation and clean-up. Reward them with popcorn and a holiday movie.

COLLIER COUNTY SPORTS COMPLEX PLANNED AT CITY GATE-DETAILS TO FOLLOW

Amateur Sports Complex – 8 Multipurpose fields (soccer/football/lacrosse), 8 baseball/softball fields, 3000sf stadium field, 120,000 sf Field House plus other amenities. Planning moving forward. Located between City Gate Industrial Park and Collier County Landfill. Phased construction to be completed in 2020.

BIG CORKSCREW ISLAND PARK UPDATE

GGEACA recently submitted to the Park and Recreation Advisory Board and the Design Consultant for BCIRP a series of recommendations and summarization of concepts brought forward through the community involvement process for the BCIRP Master Plan. Stantec developed the BCIRP Master Plan and Q. Grady Minor has been hired as the engineer for the construction plans. GGEACA wants to ensure the lessons learned in the public participation process get carried forward to the construction design/design engineer. A design and public input process is anticipated at each step of the design process noted above. Reviewing the ideas at a Parks and Recreation Advisory Board Meeting is our next approach to ensuring that the process proceeds with the input that community had invested in.

VANDERBILT BEACH ROAD EXTENSION UPDATE

At the 12-12-19 BCC Meeting GGEACA President Michael Ramsey presented the BCC with 110 signatures on petitions seeking input and non-connection to residential streets between 13th and 29th St. 11 neighbors spoke and shared their concerns with the commissioners. Commissioners were sympathetic to their concerns and directed staff to continue to review the options to the original design as presented in the agenda item. Neighbors and interested community members should monitor the development of this project and provide public comment to the Board of County Commissioners and Collier County Staff. GGEACA welcomes neighbors to join the effort and GGEACA.


