This ongoing partnership is supported through the new regulatory statues Assisted Living Facility Rule No 58AER17-1 and Nursing Home Rule No 59A-4.1265.

All Emergency Power Plans (EPP) must be submitted to Collier County Emergency Management in a specific format.


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EMERGENCY POWER PLAN (EPP) SUBMISSION CHECKLIST



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EMERGENCY POWER REQUIREMENTS

Emergency power plan is part of the Comprehensive Emergency Management Plans (CEMPs) but not for this year....

Emergency power source maintained at the facility

Internal temperatures of 81 degrees or less

Nursing homes-no less than 30 square feet per resident

ALF-no less than 20 square feet per resident-resident choice



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EMERGENCY POWER FUEL

Assisted Living
Facilities and Nursing
Homes must support
temperatures for 96
hours

There are slight
variations due to
facility size




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ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES

72 hours of onsite fuel or piped gas for 17+ beds or...

48 hours of onsite fuel or piped gas for 16 or less beds

Additional fuel onsite to achieve 96 hours upon declaration of an emergency

If fuel is restricted by regulations, you must replenish 24 hours prior to depletion

Carbon monoxide detectors are required

20 square feet per resident; or 80 percent of capacity for area cooled to 81 degrees or less



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NURSING HOMES

72 hours of onsite fuel or piped gas

Additional fuel onsite to achieve 96 hours upon declaration of an emergency

If fuel is restricted by regulations, you must replenish 24 hours prior to depletion

No less than 30 square feet per resident for area cooled to 81 degrees or less
