- Poinsettias will upset the gastrointestinal systems of dogs, cats, birds and reptiles
- Christmas Tree Preservatives will also update your little one's tummy

 Mistletoe may lower blood pressure and could cause cardiovascular collapse in dogs, cats, birds and other small animals

Be safe this holiday season.

When setting up holiday lights,
make sure they are in a location your
pet cannot reach them. Chewing electrical chords could kill your pet.

Fireworks scare MOST animals

- Keep your pets indoors to avoid your pet running away in fear of fire works.
- If your pet must go outside during fireworks, make sure your pet is on a leash, EVEN IF your pet is a cat.
- If you are having a part at your home, make sure your pet has a quiet location to rest in a crate to reduce stress on your pet.
- Do not light home fireworks around pets because the light attracts dogs specifically and the flames can burn them.
