FINAL PUBLIC NOTICE

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has received the subgrant application for Collier County Sheriff's Office-Joint Marine Operations Center repair due to damages in Hurricane Irma (DR-4337-FL PW 03342). Pursuant to Executive Order 11988 and 44 CFR Part 9.12, final notice is hereby given of FEMA's intent to provide funding for this project under the Public Assistance (PA) Program.

An initial disaster-wide Public Notice was published October 6, 2017 for Hurricane Irma. Comments and other information received were fully evaluated by FEMA along with evaluation of social, economic, environmental, and safety considerations. This notice serves as a project-specific final notice for FEMA's funding action located within the floodplain. FEMA has determined that the only practicable alternative is to locate this facility at its original location within the floodplain because the facility is functionally dependent upon its location within the floodplain.

Funding for the proposed project will be conditional upon compliance with all applicable federal, tribal, state and local laws, regulations, floodplain standards, permit requirements and conditions. This action complies with the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) requirements.

Floodplain: Project is located in an AE Zone, otherwise known as an area inundated by 1% annual

chance flooding, per Collier County FIRM Panels #12021C0828H dated 05/16/2012.

Proposed Work and Purpose: The Marco Island Sub Station, Collier County Sheriff's Office – Joint Marine Operations

Center proposes to repair their facility as a result of Hurricane Irma. Repair damages to exterior building, 4,600 SF of asphalt built up roof with 1" insulation board, light poles leaning, chain link fence, building sign, sheet metal gutters, downspouts, soffit, and VHF radio antenna and cables. Repair 1 each of A/C condenser and air handlers. Interior building damage to gypsum walls, ceiling, doors, flooring, molding and light fixtures. Replacement of building contents, tables, chairs, desks and electronic equipment.

Facility was built in 1969.

Project Alternatives: The alternative that has been considered is the no action alternative. This alternative is

not feasible as the area will remain vulnerable to flood risk, including property damage and hazards to human life and safety. With the no action alternative, continued negative impacts on adjacent infrastructure, property, residents, and the community may be experienced. Alternate locations were not considered as the marine facility is

functionally dependent upon its location within the floodplain.
