

Audubon's Corkscrew Swamp Sanctuary comprises 13,000 acres of sensitive land owned and protected by the National Audubon Society since 1954. Its renowned 2.25-mile boardwalk winds through the world's largest remaining bald cypress forest. Corkscrew is Southwest Florida's premier outdoor environmental learning center, a Ramsar Wetland of International Importance, an Important Birding Area and a Gateway to the Florida Birding Trail. The Sanctuary is located just northeast of Naples, 15 miles from I-75 off Immokalee Road (Exit 111).
