NERC Fact Sheet

The Northeast Recycling Drop-off Center, located at 825 39th Ave. N.E., Naples, FL 34120 is now open for business. The Facility is our largest recycling center at 29,000 square feet and sits on over 14 acres of property. The facility is equipped with truck scales and storage lockers for the compliant handling and collection of household hazardous waste.

In 2019, the Facility is projected to assist 11,000 customers and process an estimated 350,000 lbs. of household hazardous waste and recyclable materials such as cardboard, scrap metal, mixed plastic, and mixed paper from residents and businesses of the Golden Gate Estates Area. The facility is open Monday through Saturday 8:30 AM– 4:30 PM and provides free paper shredding up to 20 lbs. per resident on the first Saturday of each month (\$1.00 per lb. charge after the first 20 lbs.).

Household hazardous waste accepted at the Northeast Recycling Drop-off Center for commercial customers will be subject to board-approved tipping fee rates. (Attached copy of FY19 Rate Resolution. Rates start on page 5.)

Construction and Demolition Debris (C&D), yard waste, and Municipal Solid Waste (MSW) will not be accepted at the Northeast Recycling Drop-off Center. Yard Waste and C&D material should be taken to the Collier County Landfill for proper disposal. Municipal Solid Waste must be handled by our local Franchise Contractor, Waste Management Inc., of Florida for District 1 and Waste Connections Inc. for District 2.

Household hazardous waste accepted at the Northeast Recycling Drop-off Center is free of charge to all residents and includes disposal of items such as:

Oil and oil filters	Gasoline
Antifreeze	Propane Tanks
Latex & Oil Based Paint	Pool and Gardening Chemicals
Waxes & Polishes	Batteries (all types)
Ink Cartridges	Fluorescent Bulbs (including compact)
Ballasts	Mercury Containing Devices
Cardboard	Aluminum
Electronics (computers, televisions, etc.)	Cell phones
Medical Sharps & Needles that are in hard, unyielding plastic containers	Scrap Metal
