ORDINANCE AMENDING DRDINANCE 82-2, THE REGULATIONS CMPREHENSIVE ZONING FOR MINCORPORATED AREA OF COLLIER COUNTY, FLORIDA BY STRICT, AMENDING SUBSECTION 7.22.6.11(6) TO CLARIFY BAKERY SHOPS AS A PERMITTED PRINCIPAL USE; AMENDING SECTION 7.23, C-4, COMMERCIAL GENERAL DISTRICT, AMENDING SUBSECTION 7.23.6.3), TO ADD A NEW SUBSECTION "m" TO PERMIT WHOLESALING, WAREHOUSING DISTRIBUTION AS PERMITTED PROVISIONAL USES; AND TO PROVIDE AN EFFECTIVE DATE. :

WHEREAS, on September 29, 1987, the Board of County Commissioners directed Staff to clarify Ordinance 82-2, The Comprehensive Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Area of Collier County, Florida, Subsection 7.22.6.1)(b) relating to bakery shops; and

WHEREAS, on September 29, 1987, the Board also directed Staff to investigate the feasibility of allowing wholesaling, warehousing and distribution as a use in the C-4 Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, after investigation, Staff is of the opinion that wholesaling, warehousing and distribution are appropriate permitted provisional uses in the C-4 Zoning District;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF COLLIER COUNTY, FLORIDA:

SECTION ONE:

Ordinance 82-2, the Comprehensive Zoning Regulations for the Unincorporated Area of Collier County, Florida, Section 7.22, C-3, Commercial Intermediate, Subsection 7.22.b.1)(b) shall be amended to read as follows:

- b. Uses and Structures: No building or structure, or part thereof, shall be erected, altered or used, or land or water used, in whole or in part, for other than the following:
 - 1) Permitted Principal Uses and Structures:
 - (a) Antique shops; appliance stores; art studios; art supplies; automobile parts stores; automobile service stations fuel dispensing only (Subject to Section 9.8).
 - (b) Bakery shops (including baking incidental to retail)
 or-wholesale-sales; banks (branch or main office and
 financial institutions; barber and beauty shops; bath supply
 stores; blue print shops; bicycle sales and services; book
 stores.
 - (c) Carpet and floor covering sales (including storage and installation); child care centers; churches and other places of worship; clothing stores; confectionary and candy stores.
 - (d) Delicatessen; drug stores; dry cleaning shops; dry good stores and department stores.

- (e) Electrical supply stores.
- (f) Fish stores; florist shops; food markets; furnitures stores; furrier shops and fast food restaurants.
- (q) Gift shops; gourmet shops.
- (h) Hardware stores; health food stores; hobby supply stores; homes for the aged; hospitals and hospices.
- (i) Ice cream stores; ice sales, interior decorating showrooms.
- (j) Jewelry stores.
- (k) Laundries self-service; leather goods and luggage stores; locksaiths and liquor stores.
- (1) Meat market; medical office or clinic for human care; millinery shops; museums; music stores.
- (m) Office (retail or professional); office supply stores.
- (n) Paint and wallpaper stores; pet shops; pet supply stores; photographic equipment stores; post office.
- (o) Radio and television sales and service; small appliance stores; show sales and repairs; restaurants (not including drive-ins).
- (p) Souvenir stores; stationery stores; shopping centers (See Section 10.5); suppresented and sanatoriums.
- (q) Tailor shops; tobacco shops; toy shops; tropical fish stores;
- (r) Variety stores; veterinary offices and clinics (no \outside kennelling).
- (s) Watch and precision instrument sales and repair.
- (t) Any other commercial use or professional service which is comparable in nature with the foregoing uses and which the Zoning Director Determines to be compatible in the district.
- (u) Any use which was permissible under the prior GRC zoning and which was existing or for which a building permit had been issued prior to the effective date of this Ordinance.

- (i) Hotels and motels.
 (j) Time share facilities.
 (k) Retail sales of propane gas.
- (1) Television stations (offices and studios) and auxiliary transmitters and receiving equipment, but not principal transmission tower.
- (m) Wholesaling: warehousing: distribution (these three uses apply only to the principal permitted uses in the C-4 District).
