

Northeast Service Area (NESA) Utility Extension Design-Build Improvements Project

This information is being shared to keep property owners informed about the Northeast Service Area (NESA) Utility Extension Project. To respond to recent growth, Collier County recently began a design-build project to include an interim wastewater treatment plant, storage tanks and associated pipelines. This project will install pipelines to new development areas and construct interim wastewater treatment facilities. Future phases will construct regional potable water and wastewater treatment facilities on this site that will provide needed reliability to the expanding Collier County Water-Sewer District. Please note that while the general area of construction encompasses estate-zoned areas, the county will continue its policy of not extending services to estate-zoned properties, even if future pipelines front your property. Collier County held a neighborhood information meeting regarding the NESA project on Wednesday, June 26. The presentation and display boards can be found on the project website at www. Upcoming Construction Activities

Collier County and their contractors will begin work to install underground utilities across Immokalee Road and along 39th Avenue NE (Segment 1) just south of the Fairgrounds. Starting this week, traffic on Immokalee Road near 39th Avenue NE will be reduced to one lane in each direction. Motorists should expect travel lane shifts on Immokalee Road through Labor Day.

In August, crews will begin installing utilities along the north side of 39th Avenue NE (Segment 1). A 36-inch watermain will be installed along the north side of 39th Avenue NE within the county's right-of-way. Then, crews will convert the existing 16-inch pipe on the south side of 39th Avenue NE to a wastewater force main. Fire hydrants on the south side of the roadway will be deactivated and relocated to the north side of 39th Avenue NE.

General Project Overview

Segment 1 (as mentioned above) is located along 39th Avenue NE from Immokalee Road eastward towards the end of the Fairgrounds property. Construction of Segment 2 began in May and is nearing completion. Segment 2 is located within the proposed Big Corkscrew Island Regional Park boundaries just east of the Fairgrounds. Installing the pipelines within the park boundaries will avoid disturbing the new park after it is constructed. The wastewater treatment plant (located in Segment 3) is still being designed and permits will need to be acquired. The final alignment for Segment 4 has not been finalized. Currently, the start dates for Segments 5A and 5B are not known. Project completion is anticipated in late 2021.

Since project plans are still being designed, we do not have a design or details of the wastewater treatment plant at this time. This information will be shared as more information becomes available and also will be presented at a future public meeting (date to be determined).
