New Playground Symbolizes City's Rebirth


There is no better sound than that of children laughing and playing. When hurricane Irma's flood waters hit Everglades City, not only did it damage the playground equipment at McLeod park, it stripped away the symbolic center of our town and left the local children without a public playground...and almost everything we do here originates or takes place at McLeod Park. It is literally the heartbeat of the town.



From that very moment in 2017, the Everglades Lions Club focused on bringing the McLeod Park playground back to life. To do so, the club would need some significant donations. The Everglades Lions Club officers met and scheduled a series of community dinners to help raise money for the project. They also reached

out to the entire community, and to many outside of our community, to ask for help. The public responded. Over a two-year period, almost \$90,000 was raised to return the park to what it once was; a gathering place for children and adults where they can meet, play, exercise and relax.

Phase one of the project addressed the landscaping where trees and shrubs were planted around the perimeter of the park in 2018. Phase



Once the finishing touches were complete, a formal ribbon cutting ceremony was held at 1 pm...and then the children rushed in.

The sound of children playing and laughing filled the air. This phase of the McLeod Park project was complete.





The park's transformation symbolizes the City's rebirth. It demonstrates that no matter what, if you work hard and dream big, *it can happen*. And, best of all, it shows that people care, even those who do not live here care enough to donate and contribute.

The next phases of the project will address additional seating for parents and some more shade for the children. There are also plans for some exercise equipment for adults...and the pavilion needs to be painted. But on this December day, everything was perfect and phase two was completed.





LOCAL ARTIST DICK JAY'S WORK ON DISPLAY AT ART BASEL IN MIAMI **By Renee Rau**

The paintings of Plantation Island resident and artist Dick Jay were part of a special exhibit at the Untitled Art Fair, a satellite fair of Art Basel and one of the top draws during Miami Art Week. I had the opportunity to meet Dick Jay and see almost 40 of his paintings before the major crowds descended upon Miami during a special preview for the press and art buyers. Dick Jay's paintings were the first thing visitors saw upon entering the enormous state of the art tent erected directly on Miami Beach. His work was the undisputed star of the

So how does a Korean War veteran from Michigan turned artist from the Everglades end up showcasing his paintings at the largest art experience in the world? It all began with a chance encounter initiated by Georgia Garret, volunteer with the Museum of the Everglades. In 2014, (commissioned by the Norton Museum of Art in West Palm Beach) Photographer, Jim Goldberg and Curator, Jordan Stein spent several weeks immersing themselves in the culture and terrain of the Western Everglades. I spent much of this time guiding the duo of photographer and curator through the region, introducing them to the people and places that

embody heart of the Glades.

On a tour of the Museum of the Everglades, Georgia Garrett mentioned Dick Jay and suggested that Jim and Jordan pay a visit to his home and studio. Their interest was piqued, calls were made, and off they went to Plantation Island in the hopes of meeting Dick and seeing his paintings. Jordan and Dick had an immediate connection, so much so that they kept in touch forging an unlikely friendship that led to an opportunity of a lifetime.

In 2018 the Untitled Art Fair invited Jordan Stein to curate a special exhibit. The fair wanted to highlight the Everglades and raise awareness of the unique natural and cultural heritage of the region as well as illustrate issues impacting the resources from

encroaching development to climate change. Jordan immediately thought of the art of Dick Jay. Although fiercely private, Dick was open to the idea. "I want people to know that I live in the Everglades, a very important area that's in a lot of trouble. I hope my work will inspire folks to learn more about the region and help out however they can." Dick and Jordan decided on 27 paintings, many set into wooden frames crafted and painted by the artist. Jordan Stein personally collected the work and transported it to Miami for the event.

Dick's ability to paint the essence of a single moment with the use of light and color is unlike anything I've seen. His images have a lingering presence in the mind, much like the people and places he painted. I was simply awestruck by the exhibit. Dick seemed humbled and impressed, watching the droves of people pouring into the fair. We spoke about how he felt about the fair and Dick said was grateful just to be among all of the creative minds in the space.

The Art of Dick Jav is on exhibit at the Museum of the Everglades through January with a closing reception to be held January 24th from 6-8pm.

Sausage & Egg Breakfast Casserole By Elaine Middelstaedt

Ingredients:

メメメ

- 1 lb. sausage meat reg. or hot
 - 1 medium onion, 1 green pepper
 - 8 large eggs
- 2 cups milk
 - 1/2 tsp. salt & pepper
- 2 cups large croutons, more if desired
 - 2 cups shredded cheese, (used cheddar with cream cheese mix)

Directions: Sautee the onions and peppers in a large skillet until softened. Add in the broken apart sausage meat and cook completely through.

Whisk the eggs, milk, salt and pepper together in a large bowl and set aside. Lightly oil a 9 x 13 baking dish. Layer the croutons evenly on the bottom. Layer the sausage mix on top of the croutons. Layer the cheese mix evenly over the sausage mix. Gently pour the egg mixture on top.

Cover and refrigerate at least 8 hours (overnight). In the morning, preheat oven to 325°. Place the casserole in the middle of the oven. Bake for 30 minutes. Turn the heat up to 350° and bake for an additional 20-30 minutes, until the egg is set. If it browns too quickly, cover with foil. Let it sit for 10 minutes before cutting & serving. YUMMY!!!

Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Everglades City Drinking Water System

Situation:

The Everglades City public drinking water system failed to collect a sufficient number of bacteriological compliance samples during the month of October 2019. Rule 62-550.883, Florida Administrative Code, requires this water system to collect a minimum of 3 bacteriological distribution samples for each month it provides water to the public. Department records indicate that the above referenced water system only collected 2 bacteriological samples during the month of October 2019. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers you have a right to know what happened and what we did (are doing) to correct this situation.

Health Effects:

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. During the month of October 2019, we did not perform bacteriological monitoring at a sufficient number of distribution sample sites, and therefore cannot be completely sure of the microbiological quality of your drinking water at that time.

What is Being Done?

Although the above referenced public drinking water system missed performing bacteriological monitoring at 1 distribution sample site during the month of October 2019, it did perform monitoring at 2 distribution locations and both of its wells on October 13, 2019. All four samples collected on October 13, 2019, indicated the absence of coliform bacteria.

What Should Customers Do?

Since the laboratory analyses results for the bacteriological samples collected on October 13, 2019, all indicated the absence of coliform bacteria, at this time CUSTOMERS NEED NOT TAKE ANY ACTION OR SEEK AN ALTERNATE WATER SUPPLY.

With Temperatures Dropping Can You Handle the Fish? By Florida Fish & Wildlife Conservation Commission (FWC)

While many anglers sing the praises of Florida's warmer fishing months, seasoned anglers know that winter can offer great fishing opportunities for some of the state's most sought-after fish species. As the temperatures drop, you'll spot many anglers, including veteran kayak angler Stephen Stubbs, following spotted seatrout to fresher water, where the fish congregate in large schools.

While this can make spotted seatrout an easy target, this species is also especially vulnerable to fatigue and exposure, so as the winter bite turns on, it's important to use proper gear and fish handling techniques. This ensures the best chance of survival for released fish. Read on for some tips to help you handle the fishing as the weather cools down and the action heats up.

Prepping for the Day: A successful day of fishing begins with preparation. Be aware of the area you will be fishing and local fish you might catch. Know the regulations for your target species and make sure you have all the proper gear. Determining ahead of time which fish you are going to keep versus which fish you will release is an easy step to take and something that Stubbs practices regularly.

"My friends and I tend to harvest only slot trout under 19 inches to keep the more productive egg-layers (20 inches and over) in the water to continue the sustainability of this wonderful species," Stubbs said.

Some great gear to have in your stash is: Barbless circle hooks – Are 90% more likely to hook a fish in the mouth. Hooking a fish in the mouth reduces internal harm and decreases dehooking time, getting the fish back in the water faster and increasing its chance of survival. **Dehooking tool** – Allows anglers to quickly release their catch while minimizing injuries and handling time. Correct weight tackle – Using tackle heavy enough to land a fish quickly is important so fish are less exhausted and more able to avoid predators upon release. **Knotless, rubber-coated net** – These support the weight of the fish while removing a minimal amount of slime, which protects the fish from infection.

Make sure to reel the fish in as quickly as possible. According to Stubbs, the key to landing a nice trout, especially a big one, is to manage the drag tension. Horsing a trout into the boat can usually result in additional tearing of the area they are hooked, especially around the mouth. It can also cause you to lose the fish. Work them in as they tire and keep tension on the line to prevent a hook release. Playing the fish too much can result in an exhausted fish that cannot avoid predators once released.

Stubbs reminds anglers to always use a net for landing medium-to-large trout and dip/wet any measuring board with water before laying the fish on the board. That helps reduce the loss of slime and scales. Once you've got your catch to the boat, use these additional tips to ensure that fish are landed quickly and safely for the best outcome for both the angler and the fish.

Avoid removing large fish from water. If you must remove them, support their weight horizontally to prevent damage to their internal organs.

Take pictures of your catch while it is in the water. This puts less stress on the fish and the fish will look bigger. If a net is needed to land or control a fish, always use a knotless, rubber-coated landing net.

Using the correct methods to handle your fish once you've landed them is important to ensure that released fish are in prime condition when returned to the water. Return the fish to the water as quickly as possible. One of the major factors in the survival of a released fish is how much time it spends out of the water. The more fish that survive upon release today, the more fish there will be available to catch tomorrow.

Wet your hands before handling a fish to prevent damaging its protective slime coating. Don't use gloves or towels, as this will remove the protective slime.

Never hold a fish by the gill cover or eyes. Hold fish horizontally to support their internal organs. Gripping devices can be effective for controlling and handling fish, especially ones with sharp teeth. Grip behind the lower lip and support the weight of the fish in a horizontal position.

Removing a hook can be tricky. Use these tips to get the hook out and protect your trout (and other catches). If possible, keep the fish in the water while removing the hook. If the fish has swallowed the hook, cut the line as close to the hook as possible. Attempting to remove the hook can do more harm than good. Use non-stainless-steel hooks since they eventually dissolve or pass naturally. Using a dehooking tool will allow you to remove hooks safely and quickly without touching the fish, giving it a better chance to survive.

Taking steps to return fish to the water properly can be a significant factor in their survival. With a little extra effort, you can give your fish a fighting chance at survival to reproduce and fight another day. For more go to: MyFWC.com/FishHandling.

The Everglades **Backcountry Experience** With Capt. Rodney Raffield

Hi Mullet Rappers, Capt. Rodney with EBE back at you with some more fishing tales.

If you recall last month's report, I mentioned that the weather was warm for this time of year and the transitioning fish were not behaving properly.

Well since my last report, we have had a couple of good fronts which have helped put fish in a more familiar winter pattern. I am catching good numbers of Trout and Mackerel in the deeper rock holes and Snook are looking good in the Backcountry.



Reds are around and we are producing best action with shrimp tipped jigs with Zman or Wiffelures soft plastics on them.

Trout are great but they are running small with limits of legals hard to come by. We have also been producing quite a

few Pompano on my smaller jigs with most of these fish being very large in size.

Snook season is over till March but don't let that stop you from getting in on the action of what I consider our best gamefish all

My favorite lures for these guys are the aforementioned lures in Chartreuse and Pearl colors. So that's about it all that's left to say is get out there and catch that fish of a lifetime, but most of all have fun.

Stargazing in the Everglades Meteor Shower Calendar

Ursids: Next period of activity: December 17th, 2019 to December 26th

Observers will normally see 5-10 Ursids per hour during the late morning hours on the date of maximum activity. There have been occasional outbursts when rates have exceeded 25 per hour. This shower is strictly a northern hemisphere event as the radiant fails to clear the horizon or does so simultaneously with the start of morning twilight as seen from the southern tropics.

Quadrantids: Next period of activity: December 27th, 2019 to January 10th

The Quadrantids have the potential to be the strongest shower of the year but usually fall short due to the short length of maximum activity (6 hours) and the poor weather experienced during early January.

The average hourly rates one can expect under dark skies is 25. These meteors usually lack persistent trains but often produce bright fireballs. Due to the high northerly declination (celestial latitude) these meteors are not well seen from the southern hemisphere.

The Everglades Area is an official Dark Sky Location! In addition to seeing meteor showers, on a clear night observers can also see the Milky Way and countless stars by the naked eye. Fish by day...watch the stars by night!


