Staff presented the board with the December 18, 2019 Joint CRA & MSTU Meeting Minutes, CRA Operations Manager Report, CRA Project Manager Report, Budgets, and Upcoming Meetings.

G. Announcements.

1. Communications Folder

Staff reviewed the communications folder with the board and members of the public. The folder contained the public notice for this meeting, the 2020 Calendar for the CRA and MSTU meetings, Governor DeSantis open vacancy's, IUNC Housing Committee meeting and upcoming community event flyers. Ms. Anne Goodnight made a request that the June meeting be a joint meeting with MSTU on June 24, 2020 as three of the board members have another meeting to attend on the scheduled June 17, 2020. Mr. Ski Olesky also announced that the Parks and Recreation meeting will be on February 19, 2020 at the community park at 2:00 p.m.

- 2. Public Comment speaker slips
 - CRA staff reiterated the public 3-minute speaker slip policy. The board will give more time if they feel it necessary.
- 3. CRA Budget & Work Plan Workshop February 13, 2020 @ 10:00 A.M. Staff announced that the Budget and Workplan Workshop has been scheduled for February 13, 2020, members of the boards and public are encouraged to attend.
- 4. Immokalee Chamber of Commerce

Mr. Danny Gonzalez addressed the board with support towards the Immokalee Airport expansion. He feels that the expansion is positive for the community and welcomes the possibility of more businesses. He also asked for an update on the proposed 7 Eleven project. At this time staff did not have an update but will keep everyone up to date as information becomes available. As a business owner, he expressed his concerns over the food trucks that have popped up recently. His concern is that the food trucks are not following procedure or getting the permitting done before opening up for business.

H. CRA New Business.

1. Immokalee Regional Airport – Justin Lobb, Collier County Airports Manager

Mr. Justin Lobb presented the board with updates at the Immokalee Regional Airport projects. The current 2020 cycle has an estimated ten million in projects, three of which are under design. The rehabilitation of the North/South runway is one, the Taxiway extension, through FAA additional funding, is another. The last one is the security camera's for access control which will be used for the terminal and airfield. These will serve to enhance safety for planes.

A concern with the runway and taxi extension is the issue with the raceway, they are currently trying to work with the Immokalee Regional Raceway owners to come to an agreement over the issue. The property belongs to the Airport, but FAA gave them permission to lease the area for the raceway with a caveat that the property could be reverted to an actual runway. The project is set to start at the end of the year.



One of the more exciting things coming is the flight school. There has already been interest with International students from Ireland and the United Kingdom, training here is cheaper than in the UK. This will be an actual school, providing housing and meal plan.

The other exciting thing is the three parcels of commercial property that three parties have proposed to use. Each one looks very promising. One is a flight school, one is to be used as a possible hangar, and the third one cannot be disclosed at this time but will be very beneficial to the community. There is about ten acres between the three parcels.

I. CRA Old Business

- 1. Immokalee Area Master Plan update
 - Staff provided the board with the update that the 45-day grace period is almost near, a final version of the Immokalee Area Master Plan should be available next month.
- 2. Immokalee Stormwater Master Plan update
 Staff informed board that there is not a current update on the Immokalee Stormwater Master Plan
 but Mr. Robert Wiley, Project Manager, will be here to discuss stormwater projects next month.
- 3. CDBG Grant update
 - Carver & South 5th Street
 Staff informed board that this project is currently at 90% plans, awaiting the engineer to address a few items and the project should be at 100% plans within the next month. Bid documents are going out.
 - ii. FY2020-2021 Grant Application Cycle (Enclosure 6) Staff informed board that they will be applying for another grant. This would be to continue the sidewalk in the Eustis area, a map of the proposed section is in the Project Manager's report located in Enclosure 3. The window to apply is very short, deadline is February 10, 2020.

Action: Ms. Anne Goodnight made a motion to allow staff to apply for CDBG grant. Mr. Francisco Leon seconded the motion and it passed by unanimous vote. 8-0.

Staff also announced the departure of Julian Morgan, Project Manager, his last day will be January 24, 2020.

- 4. Tiger Grant Immokalee Complete Street updates
 Staff announced that RFP is being finalized to hire someone for design.
- 5. Code Enforcement update (Enclosure 7)

Mr. Chris Ambach informed the board that the final count for last month's cleanup was 17 tons. The next cleanup will be held in March. The focus of his group last year was the issues with dilapidated trailers, from October 2018 through January 2020, there have been 38 that they have addressed. The newer issues have been the excessive Food Trucks, especially on New Market Road, this is a priority for code enforcement, a senior staff member has been tasked with policing the New Market Road area, there will also be a hearing next month on the 23rd to address this issue.

One last issue that code has been working on is the homeless camps, there is a big one on South 1st, they took it to hearing and an order has been issued to pull out all the plants and vegetation in that area so that the homeless can't continue to make camps there.



6. FDOT updates

Ms. Victoria Peters addressed the board with grant information for funds with the Small Community Outreach Program Grant (SCOP). She announced that the SR82 & SR29 from Gator Slough to 29 roundabout is under construction. The final segment from Hendry county line to Gator Slough is currently under design.

8. Immokalee Culinary Accelerator

Mr. Ahmed El announced to the board that the Accelerator currently has 25 members, one of which has opened a smoothie bar in Immokalee at a local gym called Built Beast Gym, the member is Tomahawk Nutrition. One member has come up with human grade pet food, another member has opened up a food cart at Ave Maria whose food is Columbian Cuisine, and the member will also be working with Robert's Ranch and the Cattle Drive on March 14, 2020.


3. Sidewalk Projects in Immokalee

4. TIGER (Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery) Grant

Immokalee Complete Streets TIGER Grant -\$16,415,864 Project total. Funding sources are FHWA grand funds (80%) = \$13,132,691 County match funds (20%) = \$3,283,173.

- Includes design and construction of 20 Miles of concrete sidewalks, a bike boulevard network, a shared-use path, street lighting, bus shelters, a new transit center, landscaping, drainage improvements, and intersection and traffic calming retreats.
- Collier County has provided the CRA with an overview of estimated schedule with milestones.
 The design/build portion of this project is set to start Winter 2020 and construction is set to be completed Winter 2023.

5. Commercial Façade Grant

Program is in place and being reviewed for revisions.

- On June 19, 2019 CRA board approved Lozano's Mini Mart for a \$20,000 façade grant for improvements to property located at 102 New Market Rd.
- Staff is collecting backup documentation from property owner.

6. FHERO

Florida Heartland Economic Region of Opportunity – updates Staff will attend FHERO monthly meeting on March 09, 2020. FHERO was awarded a \$22,000 grant to prepare an Economic Strategic Plan for Immokalee. Site Tour will be conducted by VisonFirst on March 13, 2020.



7. Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition

The Housing Committee met on January 8, 2020 and provided updates on housing improvements in Immokalee. The committee is working on revising the Immokalee Disaster Recover Resiliency Plan and funding options for future projects. The Immokalee Unmet Needs Coalition (IUNC) is a long-term recovery group that formed in the fall of 2017 as the result of Hurricane Irma. This group is composed of non-profits, faith based, local, state or national organizations who work together to meet the unmet of Immokalee residents impacted by disaster. The IUNC works in collaboration with other agencies to assess needs, offer resources and ensure that residents are assisted after their resources (FEMA, SBA loans, and personal insurance) have been exhausted.

Our objectives are to:

- Provide residents with spiritual and emotional care management.
- Home repairs according to unmet needs funding
- Community care through case management.

Priorities

The Immokalee Unmet Needs goal is to assure that our community is prepared for future disaster by:

- Educating about the process and resources for recovery
- Joining the county Emergency Management Plan (Including the IUNC in the Emergency Management Plan assures that necessary decisions are made beforehand.)
- Keeping donations local
- Workshops
- Improving communication

8. EPA Brownfields Coalition Assessment Grant

Awarded to the Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council. Immokalee site identified in the grant was the **Immokalee Regional Airport** (165 Airpark Blvd., Immokalee, FL. 34142).

Airport staff is coordinating with Terracon to complete assessment.






10. The Face of Immokalee

Michelle Tricca, a local Artist, presented The Face of Immokalee, a proposed outdoor photography installation celebrating the soul of Immokalee. CRA board supported the project and have formed a subcommittee to move the project forward.

The subcommittee met on December 9th to discuss the art wall options for the old McCrory's building (S&O Grocery), Lipman Produce (trucks/building), site on 1st Street (Gadsden blue building), and the Zocalo plaza. Committee supported rendering provided by artist with minor changes. Ms. Tricca's photos were selected to be displayed at the BCC Chamber now through February 29, 2020.



11. Collier County Opportunity Zone Program

A new community and economic development tool to drive long-term private investment in low-income communities!

Collier County hopes to leverage Opportunity Zones as an important tool to support the development of jobs, affordable housing and economic vitality in five areas in Golden Gate, Naples Manor and in and around Immokalee.

Low Tax Opportunity Zones, established by the federal Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017, encourage long-term investment and job creation in targeted communities by reducing taxes for many job creators. They enhance the ability to attract businesses, developers and financial institutions to invest in these targeted areas — distressed communities — by allowing investors to defer capital gains taxes through investments Low Tax Opportunity Zones, established by the federal Tax Cut and Jobs Act of 2017, encourage long-term investment and job creation in targeted communities by reducing taxes for many job creators. The zones enhance local communities' ability to attract businesses, developers and financial institutions to invest in targeted areas by allowing investors to defer capital gains taxes through investments in federally established Opportunity Funds.

It's an economic and community development tax incentive program that provides a new impetus for private investors to support distressed communities through private equity investments in businesses and real estate ventures. The incentive is deferral, reduction and potential elimination of certain federal capital gains taxes.

U.S. investors hold trillions of dollars in unrealized capital gains in stocks and mutual funds alone, a significant untapped resource for economic development!

To become a Qualified Opportunity Fund, an eligible corporation or partnership self-certifies by filing Form 8996, Qualified Opportunity Fund, with its federal income tax return.



Project Manager Report 02/12/2020



1. Pedestrian Safety Improvements

i. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase III – Eustis Avenue



On February 6, 2020 the CRA applied for a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for the construction of sidewalks along Eustis Avenue.

Project area is highlighted in yellow (see above) from South 5th Street to South 1st Street (about .3 mile). Current and completed projects are highlighted in orange (see above).

Total cost for the project (design and construction) is estimated at \$380,000 over two fiscal years. The MSTU (Fund 162) will design the project in FY20, anticipated cost is \$60,000. The CRA (Fund 186) will contribute \$20,000 for CEI services in FY21.

In FY21, if grant funds are awarded, a Budget Amendment of \$320,000 will be initiated to recognize the grant revenue of \$300,000 and \$20,000 in CRA Fund 186. Although this grant application does not require a match; the CRA is pledging a monetary match of \$20,000 for CEI services for the project in fiscal year (FY21). Total contribution to this project by the MSTU and CRA is \$80,000.

ii. SR 29 (Main Street) from North 9th Street to North 1st Street (Project #439002-1)

Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) partnered with the Community Redevelopment Agency (CRA) and the Municipal Service Taxing Unit (MSTU) to program a project on SR 29 in Immokalee due to a history high bicycle and pedestrian crashes and activity.

The purpose of the project is to increase pedestrian and bicyclist safety and consists of installing two RRFBs (Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons), signing and pavement marking improvements, reconstruction of the lighting system, constructing a new signal at 3rd Street, drainage improvements, and sidewalk enhancements. The project is estimated at 1.98 Million. The FDOT Project Manager for this project is David Jones.



Project Schedule:

- 100% design completed in May 2019.
- Out for bid by July 2019.
- Award the contract to the contractor by December 2019.
- Construction will begin within 60/90 days after awarded contract (April 2020).
- Expected completion by September 2020.

Background:

- FDOT will pay the cost to install 30 standard LED light Poles.
- MSTU will pay the cost difference to add the enhancements.

The MSTU provided an advance deposit of \$125,342 to FDOT for installation of holiday attachments on 30 light poles and all efforts associated with adding the attachments, including banner arms, GFCI outlets, additional conductors, mobilization and maintenance of traffic at SR29 from 1st Street North to 9th Street North in Immokalee.



iii. Immokalee Sidewalk Project Phase II

Carver Street and S. 5th Street (funded with CDBG and CRA funds) Project #33588.1

The CRA received a total of \$676,365 of HUD funding allocation for CDBG projects. The Immokalee Sidewalk 2018 Improvement Project will allow the CRA to complete sidewalk improvements along a portion of Carver Street & South 5th Street. The CRA has allocated \$100,000 for design in fiscal year 2019 and \$60,000 for construction in fiscal year 2020. The total project cost is estimated at \$860,000. Depending on cost estimate the CRA may have to use additional funds to complete the project.

This project is part of a sidewalk implementation program in Immokalee, which will provide many benefits including safety, mobility, and healthier communities. The sidewalks will make the community more attractive to potential businesses to come to the community, thus will increase job opportunities.



Action Plan:

- 90% Plans were submitted for review which ended on December 31, 2019.
- A couple of reviews came back with responses. We received commend from CAT and the ISWD.
- We need to schedule a meeting soon.
- Also, ABB will send-out our survey crew to survey the improvements associated with 125 Carver Street. Hopefully, the finish in a timely manner once they start.
- ABB has used the proposed design information provided from the County to act as the existing drainage conditions for the 90% plan submittal.
- Once we have the review comments back, we can schedule another meeting to discuss them and any other plan changes you might want to see.
- ABB anticipates 30-45 days to turn around the final 100% plans. We can look at your grant schedule at that point if we need to fine tune the delivery date.

iv. Blue Light Poles

Light poles inspection and mapping. Staff is conducting an assessment and inventory of existing light poles in district area. Staff will determine if poles in the project area can be reconfigured into knockdown areas or other areas that need lighting. Staff will investigate options for storage of the poles and bring forward to a future meeting.

Status of Insurance Claims:

- Claim #50-09011909629 for Pole #11 is pending SR29 & New Market Rd West.
- Claim #53-03101808019 for Pole #20 is being paid in installments so it's not listed and pending.

Total reimbursed this fiscal year is \$53,778.97 to MSTU funds (\$52,878.97 fund 162 and \$900 fund 111).

2. Trash Cans & Garbage Pickup

Staff is continuing cleanup efforts with our Maintenance Contractor, Waste Connections and our Community Taskforce to keep Immokalee clean.

3. Zocalo Plaza

- i. Parks & Recreation Monthly Maintenance
 - Staff is doing monthly maintenance of plaza. Monthly reports are being provided to CRA staff on a quarterly basis.
 - Staff is billing CRA & MSTU funds quarterly.

4. Beautification Enhancements

- i. Welcome Signs (Monuments)
 - 1. Repairs to Monument Sign on SR 29 (Triangle Area) & Monument on 1st Street and Eustis Avenue. Update: Lykins was awarded the contract to do repairs and replacement totaling \$48,815.
 - 2. Replacement/New Monument Sign on 1St Street and SR29 (Farm Workers Village) Update: Pending easement access.

5. Roadway Improvements

i. SR 82 Road Widening Project Gator Slough Lane to SR 29 (Project # 430849-1.

The Florida Depart of Transportation (FDOT) held an information session for the community to illustrate plans and renderings for the up and coming four lane roadway widening project which is to include a roundabout. Improvements will be made to a stretch of 3.2 miles of roadway. The community outreach manager is Lisa Macias. The Project Manager is Dennis Day.



Roundabout added features:



RE: State Road 29 Widening - Panther Crossing Bridge Replacement - Immokalee

Dear Commissioner McDaniel:

The Immokalee Local Redevelopment Advisory Board requests Collier County Board of Commissioners coordinate with Florida Department of Transportation to assure that the current bridge that connects Farm Workers Village to Village Oaks Elementary School is replaced with a new bridge when SR29 is widened from two to four lanes. Maintaining an elevated pedestrian crosswalk over SR29 is necessary to assure pedestrians safety between the two community destinations.

As you know, in Immokalee pedestrian infrastructure is especially important because nearly 33% of the population either use public transit, bike, or walk to work. Many of the students walk to school and 20% of Immokalee do not have access to a car.

The existing bridge has served the community for the past 27 years. It provides safe passage to the estimated 200 students that live in Farm Workers Village today. The proposed expanded roadway will make crossing SR29 more difficult and dangerous without a replacement bridge.

It is our understanding that Collier County owns and maintains the existing bridge and it may be up to the County to replace the bridge. We would request that the County program funding and coordinate with FDOT to assure that the bridge is replaced as part of the road widening project. The CRA would like to be included in the discussion of the bridge replacement to provide input on the design options.
