SAJ-2020-01626 Collier County CWIP – Public Notice Newspaper Notice

The Jacksonville District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) has received an application for a Department of the Army (DA) permit pursuant to Section 404 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. §1344) from the Collier County Coastal Zone Management Section for the proposed Collier County Comprehensive Watershed Improvement Plan (CWIP) project. The CWIP proposes restoration of hydrologic conditions of 9,000+acres of the wetland forest that was historically part of a much larger Rookery Bay Watershed draining from the north and will reduce freshwater flows to Naples Bay. Water withdrawn from the Golden Gate Canal during high flow periods will be moved through a canal to the Picayune Strand State Forest and after passing through a spreader swale, will pass slowly south to Rookery Bay as sheet flow. Impacts will include approximately 35 acres of direct impacts and about 20 acres of indirect impacts to wetlands and surface waters associated with the excavation of new drainage canal systems, construction of weirs, underflow gates, culverts, spreader swales, and pump stations. The project site is a 25,000+/- acre area within the Picayune Strand State Forest and adjacent lands located immediately east of Naples, Collier County, Florida.
