The CMC designation also requires pertinent experience in a municipality. The CMC program prepares the applicants to meet the challenges of the complex role of the Municipal Clerk by providing them with quality education in partnership with institutions of higher learning, as well as State / Provincial / National Associations. The CMC program has been assisting clerks to excel since 1970.

There are only 146 MMC's in all of Florida, and 1388 worldwide.

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CHANGES IN REGULATIONS SHORTEN STONE CRAB SEASON BY FWC

Several recreational and commercial stone crab regulation changes go into effect in the next few weeks, just in time for the Oct. 15 season start date. Florida's stone crab fishery has experienced a long-term decline in harvest and is likely undergoing overfishing. FWC staff worked with stakeholders on these changes that are intended to increase the stone crab population and build resiliency in the fishery.

New regulations in effect this season:

- ◆ The minimum claw size limit will be 2 7/8 inches (an 1/8 inch increase).
- ◆ Possession of whole stone crabs on the water will be limited to two checker boxes, each up to 3 feet by 2 feet by 2 feet OR a total volume of 24 cubic feet. Checker boxes are used to hold crabs onboard a vessel before they are measured and legal-sized claws are removed.
- ◆ The season will now end on May 2.
- ◆ All plastic and wood stone crab traps will need to be outfitted with a 2 3/16-inch escape ring before the 2023/2024 season.



Recreational Trap Registration

As a reminder, recreational harvesters who are age 16 and older and fish with traps are required to complete an online, no-cost recreational stone crab trap registration and place their registration number on their traps before using them. To register, visit GoOutdoorsFlorida.com, sign in, click the blue "Purchase a License" button, scroll down to the "Saltwater Permits" section, and select "Recreational Stone Crab Trap Registration."

Upon completion, each person will receive unique trap registration numbers that must be included on each trap along with the owner's full name and address. This information must be legible and must be permanently attached to each trap.

Other tips and regulations

Care should be taken when removing the claws so as to not permanently injure the crab.

Claws may not be taken from egg-bearing stone crabs. Stone crabs may not be harvested with any device that can puncture, crush or injure a crab's body. Examples of devices that can cause this kind of damage include spears and hooks.

Recreational harvesters may take a daily bag limit of 1 gallon of claws per person or 2 gallons per vessel, whichever is less, and may use up to five stone crab traps per person.

Recreational and commercial traps may be baited and placed in the water Oct. 5, but claws cannot be harvested or possessed until Oct. 15. Traps that are not being fished should be removed from the water to avoid ghost fishing, a process in which marine species get caught in the trap for extended periods of time and are not harvested. Stone crab regulations are the same in state and federal waters.

The 7th Annual SWAMP Celebration for the Parks at Clyde Butcher's Big Cypress Gallery! October 24 & 25, 2020



Each year Clyde and Niki Butcher host a fall festival at their Big Cypress Gallery. As part of the fun, we host "SWAMP Alongs", special swamp walks behind the gallery that raise money for the Swamp Water and Me Program (SWAMP) in Big Cypress National Preserve. SWAMP is an outdoor science education program that introduces thousands of 6th-grade students from Collier County to the Big Cypress every year on school field trips.

This year's Fall Festival / Gallery Open House with Clyde has been canceled as a result of COVID-19, but the SWAMP Celebration walks will be held with social distancing measures in place. Total attendance will be cut by 50% this year so be sure to register early to reserve your spot! This will be a very low key and safe event. MASKS REQUIRED

The walks are \$60 per person (use early bird promo code SWAMP10 through Sept 30 for a \$10 discount) with proceeds supporting the Swamp Water and Me Program (SWAMP) in Big Cypress National Preserve.

Walks are offered every hour Oct 24 & 25 from 8:00 AM - 3:00 PM. When you purchase your tickets, you select your time slot. Walks will leave every hour on the hour, rain-or-shine. Each walk is limited to 10 participants with social distancing measures in place.

Due to limited capacity for COVID-19 safety measures, you cannot switch your registered time slot the day of the event. Please plan to arrive 20 min before your walk to ensure you arrive at the gallery on time and have time to check -in.

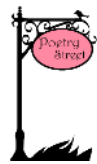
Age Connections

I do not remember when David and Diana Curry offered us two "tuxedo" kittens that had been born in North Miami near David's paint shop, but it certainly was more than ten years ago.



The two boy cats came with the names of Sylvester and Rocky. Sylvester was appropriately enough a replica of the cartoon cat, but Rocky was quickly renamed as Sammy Katz, since he was much more of a kvetch than a fighter. We referred to the two of them as "half a cat, and cat and a half" because of their weight disparities. Sylvester was happy enough to spend most of his time indoors, but Sammy was our nearly feral cat. He spent most of his time outdoors underneath our stilt home, and usually under a car. He would come in when I picked up the paper in the morning, and nibble on the dry food before coming into the kitchen for a bit of canned food. If I had gone into my office, he would come down the hall and let me know with a few quick mews that he was ready to go back outside.

This morning, he actually ate a bit from four food bowls before asking to go outside. I attended the MPO meeting via Zoom, which ended around 10 a.m. and was catching up on emails, getting ready to leave for engagements in Naples, when suddenly there was an unusual thunderous sound on my back deck and a cat screech. I ran to the slider in my bedroom to the sight of a large black dog attacking my little Sammy!

Long sad story short, two big dogs had come into my fenced in yard through a gate unfortunately left open, and had run up the back stairs and had attacked my little cat. He was on his back being bitten and stomped upon. I took him to my vet, and he had such severe injuries that he had to be put down.

Looking on the bright side, he was himself and lived life to the fullest, until the final few hours. It was fortunate that we were home when the attack occurred, and were able to get him quickly to the vet for evaluation. His last minutes were at peace, purring while being petted, before the euthanasia.

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The Island Kitchen
My Stone Crab Mustard Sauce

Ingredients:

- 1 Cup Mayonnaise
- 3 tablespoons Dijon mustard
- 1 tablespoon horseradish
- 3 dashes (or more) cayenne pepper



It is that time of year again. *It's time to get cracking!* Stone crab season started on October 15th, so if you haven't had any yet, what are you waiting for?

No two mustard sauces are alike! This recipe is a bit spicier than most, but if you like spicy give it a try. I would add a 1/2 teaspoon or more of the cayenne pepper, but that may be a bit too much for some - so taste and add the pepper to taste. It may also be eliminated altogether.

If you prefer your crabs warm with butter, that is easy too. Just boil water and drop the crabs in for a minute, just enough to heat them. Serve them with garlic butter for dipping. No matter how you prefer them, it is quick, easy and delicious!

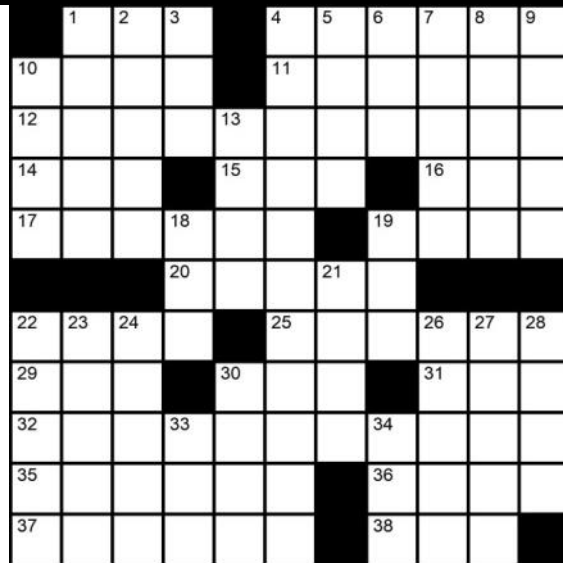
