Tropical Storm ETA Brushes Coast Dumps 3+ Inches of Rain

In this unprecedented hurricane season, it is only fitting that a few weeks after Halloween our area would get a good scare.

Tropical Storm ETA, which was a strong as a category 4 prior to slamming into Nicaragua, gave hurricane modelers quite a headache as they were trying to zero in on where the storm would eventually track. The "spaghetti" models. which was a very fitting name in this case, had the storm cutting through Cuba heading north and then veering off west and then back towards the east leaving SW Florida guessing whether to shutter up or not.

Fortunately, the re-strengthening never happened for us and its brush with the Everglades area was nothing more than a very windy week with quite a bit of rain.

There was one palm down in the median on Copeland Avenue in Everglades City and lots of standing water. However, you will not find one single resident complaining about that!

This 2020 hurricane season fired off one storm after another first in the Atlantic and later in the Gulf of Mexico. So many that we had to reach into the Greek Alphabet for more names after A to Z was exhausted.

Fortunately for us, this year's Gulf of Mexico storms steered towards somewhere between Texas and the panhandle of Florida. Unfortunately for Louisiana, they seemed to be the primary target this year with 4 landfalls impacting the area. As of this writing, computer models are projecting what's left of ETA to head towards Louisiana again...maybe.

Later season storms are nothing new. Hurricane Wilma hit our area on October 24th, 2005. The day after the storm passed, a cool front entered the area.

Everglades Community Church Pastor Bob Wallace Honors Veterans





On Sunday, November 8, Pastor Bob Wallace wore his Navy Whites and sang a song representing each branch of the military service to honor and recognize service veterans.

The pastor asked that the veterans in attendance rise and stand as the congregation sand the song representing the branch of the service they served in. Pictured bottom left; former Marine Cecil Barker stands as the Marine hymn is sung by the congregation.

Everglades Community Church was established in 1926. The building they are in today was completed in 1940. The land was donated by Barron Gift Collier with the stipulation that the church be completed by 1940, and that the church be designated non-denominational. Both criteria were met and the Church is still at that same location today.

The building was constructed using ship-lap siding and Dade County pine flooring. On September 4, 2007, The City of Everglades City proclaimed the church to be historically preserved because it "provides links with the aspirations and attainments of the City's pioneers and their descendants." The

bell tower and narthex were repaired in June 2008, as the first step in a complete restoration of the building.

In 2017, Hurricane Irma ripped through the area bringing with it a significant storm surge. The church suffered water damage and was restored with help from many of the parishioners.

Everglades Community Church is located at 101 Copeland Avenue South, just across from City Hall in the circle. Sunday services are held at 11 am. If you would like more information, contact them at 239-784-7318.



SAWFISH NEWS by Tonya Wiley, Havenworth Coastal Conservation Anglers Can Help with Sawfish Conservation and Recovery

The population of smalltooth sawfish (Pristis pectinata) in the United States experienced a dramatic decline during the 20th century caused by overfishing, habitat loss, and the species'

limited reproductive potential. Given the decline, NOAA Fisheries listed the U.S. population of smalltooth sawfish as "endangered" under the Endangered Species Act (ESA) in 2003. The ultimate goal of the listing is to recover the population to the point that it no longer needs the protections of the ESA; therefore, NOAA Fisheries convened the U.S. Smalltooth Sawfish Recovery Implementation Team (SSRIT) to develop and implement a plan to recover the U.S smalltooth sawfish population. The team identified the most severe threats to the population and recommended specific steps for recovery, focusing on (1) educating the public to minimize human interactions with sawfish and any associated injury and mortality, (2) protecting and/or restoring important sawfish habitats, and (3) ensuring sawfish abundance and distribution increase.

As the SSRIT lead, I am happy to report that, despite the pandemic, our team has been able to continue our work to implement the recovery plan, protect the remaining sawfish in the United States, and rebuild the population. One of the best ways to track the effectiveness of ongoing management and conservation efforts is to collect information about the sawfish encounters of divers, fishers, and others. Details of public sightings and captures of sawfish can substantially increase the data we have about the species, allowing us to make management and policy decisions that are reflective of the realities in the water. Because of their countless hours on the water, we are seeking to partner with the angling community to collect information about their sawfish interactions.

Our team developed the guidelines below to inform anglers about how to safely and legally release any sawfish accidentally caught while fishing:

- ♦ Release sawfish immediately
- ♦ Leave the sawfish, especially the gills, in the water at all times
- ♦ Never lift a sawfish from the water or drag it ashore
- ♦ Do not use gaffs or ropes to secure any captured sawfish
- ♦ Cut the line as close to the hook as safely possible
- ♦ Share the details of your sawfish catch with scientists

Anglers should note that advertising fishing trips or charters aimed at catching endangered smalltooth sawfish can be considered "targeting," which is a violation of the ESA. And I strongly urge that the following conservation messaging be included in all social media posts regarding sawfish catches: Sawfish are protected under the Endangered Species Act. Help protect this critically endangered species by following NOAA Fisheries handling and release guidelines available at www.SawfishRecovery.org.

You can promote sawfish recovery by following these guidelines and educating others about them. Please share your sawfish encounters by visiting www.SawfishRecovery.org, calling 1-844-4SAWFISH, or emailing sawfish@myfwc.com.

Your encounter reports will be used to track recovery of the population and steer research efforts, which will ultimately benefit the species and the areas in which you fish.

GARBAGE & YARD WASTE PICKUP 101 Here is What Waste Management Is Looking For In Collier County & Everglades City

Sometimes it gets put out but not picked up. Why? Well, there are very specific rules when it comes to garbage and yard waste and if we don't follow them, they may not pick it up.

As of October 2005, yard waste is no longer collected in plastic bags. Plastic bags are fine for household garbage placed in the green trash cans.

Yard waste must be prepared for collection by either:

- Placing in personal containers no larger than 45 gallons, weighing no more than 50 pounds when filled.
- ♦ Placing in paper bags/sacks.
- Tying in bundles no longer than four feet in length.
- No branches thicker than four inches in diameter.
- ♦ No more than ten (10) bundles or containers.
- ♦ No Plastic Bags.

There will be NO collection services of any kind - trash, recycling, bulky items or yard waste - on the following holidays: Fourth of July, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.

If your regular collection day falls on any of these holidays, collection will be made on your next regularly scheduled collection day.

Regular collection services will occur on all other holidays (e.g., Memorial Day, Labor Day, New Years Day, etc.) Customer Service phone lines - (239) 252-2380 - are open on all other holidays from 8:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M.

No Arrests Yet For Illegally Poached **Smalltooth Sawfish Dumped Along** Canal in Everglades City

There is a \$25,000 Reward for Information

NOAA officials seek information from anyone who may have details about 7 smalltooth dumped along the causeway from Everglades City to Chokoloskee, and are offering a reward up to \$20,000 for information leading to a criminal conviction or the assessment of a civil penalty.

The Center for Biological Diversity announced an additional \$5,000 reward, increasing the overall reward to \$25,000.

Smalltooth sawfish were added on the Endangered Species List in 2003. Killing a sawfish is a Class-A misdemeanor, punishable by up to a year in prison and a fine of up to \$100,000.

Mom's Thanksgiving Date Nut Cake by Kathy Brock

Ingredients:

1 1/2 cups self rising flour

2 cups sugar

1 1/2 tsp baking soda

 $1 \frac{1}{2}$ tsp salt

1/2 tsp each cloves & allspice

3/4 tsp cinnamon

1 1/2 cups applesauce

1/2 cup water

1/2 cup butter

2 eggs

1 1/2 cups chopped dates

1 cup chopped walnuts



Directions: Heat oven to 350°. Cream butter, sugar, eggs, and add in spices, baking soda, apple sauce, and water. Blend in flour until creamy. Fold in nuts and dates.


Grease and flour 2 loaf pans (8 1/2 x 4 1/2 x 2). Bake for 45–50 minutes or until a toothpick comes out clean. There will usually be a split in the top of the loaf when it is done. Serve with cream cheese. It is also excellent sliced thin and toasted!
