The Winter Bite in the 10,000 Islands by Captain Mike Merritt



The fishing has remained very good even though we have had some cold fronts come through. Colder water temps have moved most of the Snook fishing into the backcountry. There are lots of smaller fish, and they are being very cooperative. Using jigs or soft plastics is the way to go. A single hook is much easier for releasing these fish unharmed. Just make sure you use

something with a good hook that won't straighten out when you finally hook up with that big fish. We have been catching plenty of fish in the rivers, back bays, and creeks. Cover as much shoreline as you can and something good is bound to happen.

Redfish continue to bite good on the outside on the rising tide. The backcountry is getting more Reds each week and the rivers are holding good fish too. Tip that jig with some shrimp and slow it down for these guys. If you find one, chances are, there will be more in that area.

Black Drum, Sheepshead, and Snapper are also being caught and the best bet for these is shrimp. Fish on a cork or on a knocker rig. A jig tipped with shrimp will also work for these. Hard bottom is what you want to find. That will increase your chances for these guys. Moving water is also critical. Sometimes, incoming tide will be better, and sometimes outgoing tide is best. It may depend on the spot your fishing as some are better on a certain tide. This is something you learn with experience.

Seatrout are a real popular winter fish as they are some of the easier prey. These can be found on the outside, in the rivers, and in the backcountry. Right now the bite is on fire! Popping corks with shrimp or my favorite the DOA shrimp. Jigs again will produce tipped with shrimp or not. If the tide is moving chances are you will find Seatrout.

Good luck with whatever you are chasing and enjoy the mild weather while you can. 'til next time! Capt. Mike Merritt



Florida's Exotic Species Top 10 Florida Invasive Species Content by Chris Herlovich

Florida is home to many interesting species of birds, reptiles, fish and marine life, and mammals. Our climate is mild and almost anything can find a way to make Florida their home.

For many years, the sale of exotic species came through the ports of south Florida. In the 1960's & 1970's many people had "exotic' pets. Snakes, monkeys, apes (Yes, monkeys & apes!), owls and other birds, Caiman Crocodiles, countless lizards and iguanas, and several fish species both fresh and salt water species.

It's always great getting that baby animal, but too often, those baby animals grew into something not quite as cuddly and owners were forced with a difficult decision. When that happened, off to the Everglades they would go!

Today, many of those on the top 10 list were the same species that were quite common as pets...back in the day, and still (illegally) today.

On a side note, some may have also arrived via ship, in plants, etc...no matter how they got here, they are here to stay now.

In the upcoming issues this column will provide information on each of the species on this list, its status, and what is being done to control it (if anything).

Winter is Stargazing Time in SWFL Quadrantids: Peak January 2 & 3



The **Quadrantids** have the potential to be the strongest shower of the year but usually fall short due to the short length of maximum activity (6 hours) and the poor weather experienced

during early January. The average hourly rates one can expect under dark skies is 25. These meteors usually lack persistent trains but often produce bright fireballs. Due to the high northerly declination (celestial latitude) these meteors are not well seen from the southern hemisphere.

Shower details - Radiant: 15:18 +49.5° - ZHR: 120 - Velocity: 26 miles/sec (medium - 42.2km/sec) - Parent Object: 2003 EH (Asteroid)

Next Peak - The Quadrantids will next peak on the Jan 2-3, 2021 night. On this night, the moon will be 84% full.

Helpful Hints...

You can't get the darn bag open in the produce department. There is nothing more frustrating than trying to put the produce in a bag fumbling with dry fingers. Next time you go to the store, get a bag of frozen peas (you can always use a bag of frozen peas!) and use the condensation from the bag to wet your fingers. The bag will open right up with those nice moistened fingers (Some produce departments have misters. If yours does, head over there)! OR, you can always bring your own reusable bags and forget about the plastic altogether!

Do we really need a different cleaner for everything we do in the house? One trip to the store and it is obvious that there is a product for everything. To save money and space, learn about other uses for the stuff you may already have.

For example, hydrogen peroxide is reasonably priced and is a force in the household. It removes protein stains (blood) better than almost anything. It removes wine stains too (just sayin').

Hydrogen peroxide is an oxidizer and great whitener. Make a paste of hydrogen peroxide and baking soda and use it to brighten your teeth. It also freshens the breath, and promotes good gum health.

Hydrogen peroxide is a natural anti-bacterial and disinfectant. Use it to clean surfaces in your kitchen and around the home. 1/4 cup hydrogen peroxide added to cool water in your kitchen sink will clean fresh vegetables. Rinse them with cool water after taking them from the peroxide bath. These are just a few of the uses!
