



The Marco Island Executive Airport supports tourism, recreational and business travel. The airport also offers flight training services and is home to the Marco Island Squadron of the Civil Air Patrol, which serves as the official civilian auxiliary of the United States Air Force, performing key missions that include emergency services, search and rescue missions and disaster relief operations.

In the spring of 2018, the Collier County Airport Authority, in participation with the Florida Department of Transportation, embarked on the journey of constructing a new terminal facility that would best serve the needs and expectations of residents and transient customers. The previous terminal facility and infrastructure was constructed in 1974 by a private operator and over time has grown to become incompatible with current Federal Aviation Administration design standards. The previous facility was simply too close to our active runway.

The expansion is part of a multiphase initiative to modernize our public services while improving passenger and pilot safety. The new 16,500-square-foot terminal features modern amenities such as a pilot and passenger lounge, flight planning stations, airport administrative offices, lease space for aeronautical business operations, air charter operators, and rental car concessions. Within one month

of occupying the facility, while recovering for a pandemic no less, staff has witnessed tremendous value in additional space afforded which allows us to better serve our residents and customers.

The Marco Island Executive Airport hosts an estimated 58,400 aircraft operations per year. In 2019 the Florida Department of Transportation conducted a comprehensive economic impact analysis measuring on-airport, visitor spending, and multiplier impacts from aviation activity at the Airport. The assessment reported a total annual economic impact of \$31.7 million with an on-airport impact of \$11 million.

Marco Hangars, LLC commenced construction of eight (8) 70' x 56' and three (3) 110' x 80' box hangars back in early January 2021 at the Marco Island Executive Airport. The Authority approved a Leasehold Agreement with Marco Hangars, LLC to construct aircraft storage hangars with the impetus arising from an extremely high demand for aircraft storage hangars. The Leasehold Agreement provided an opportunity to fulfill customer demand, while generating additional revenue through lease proceeds and fuel sales, without the significant upfront capital expense required by the Authority, with the added benefit of the construction of common-use infrastructure that will become the property of the Authority, including the construction and extension of an internal airport access roadway that will extend from the terminal parking lot to the leasehold property site.



PROJECT UPDATES

1. Marco Island Executive Airport - Apron Expansion


With FAA (90%) and FDOT (5%) support, Quality Enterprises was selected to complete this construction project which includes demolishing the old terminal facility, constructing an aircraft apron where the old terminal and associated infrastructure existed and perform various associated airfield safety improvements. The project is currently 90% complete.


2. Immokalee Regional Airport -**Runway 18-36 Rehabilitation** In February 2021, the Airport Authority commenced the rehabilitation of Runway 18-36 which currently utilizes original pavement that dates to the airport's activation as an Army Air Corps training base during WWII (1942). Preferred Materials is the construction contractor responsible for reconstruction along with new lighting, grading/drainage, electrical and signage to meet modern FAA safety standards. This project is 80% grant funded by FDOT.



3. Immokalee Regional Airport - Taxiway C Extension

Separate from the runway rehabilitation project, Ajax Paving commenced construction to extend Taxiway Charlie approximately 3,000 feet to the north to connect with Taxiway Bravo and Immokalee's primary Runway 09-27 which will eliminate the need for aircraft to cross Runway 18-36 twice to access the FBO terminal facility from the primary runway. The project's primary objective is to increase operational safety while improving airport capacity. This project is 95% grant funded by FAA/FDOT and is currently 20% complete.

Everglades Airpark - Old Farts Flying Club Lunch Fly-In Event on March 25, 2021.

Located in the Stone Crab capital of the World, the Everglades Airpark just might one of the most unique general aviation destinations in Florida – maybe in United States. People fly in from all over this Country to test their piloting skills on Florida's second shortest public use runway (2,400 feet) which also happens to be surrounded by Chokoloskee Bay on three sides. The Airport's distinctive features are not the only enticements, seafood connoisseurs venture to this location to partake in the local cuisine that many argue is unmatched anywhere else in the state.

On March 25th, our team of Line Technicians were greeted by 53 airplanes transporting pilots and passengers that patronized five local restaurants over the Lunch Period - proving once again the contribution our Airports make to the Economy of our Collier County. Florida Department of Transportation reported a total annual economic impact of \$2.28 million for the Everglades Airpark in 2019.




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
COLLIER 311 EVACUATION ZONE MAPS
