SAWFISH NEWS by Tonya Wiley, Havenworth Coastal Conservation

Ball Bungees Pose Threat for Endangered Sawfish



Entanglement of marine species in discarded lines, fishing gear, and other garbage and debris is a problem seen with unfortunate regularity. This includes Endangered species such as North Atlantic right whales, giant manta rays, sturgeon, sea turtles, and smalltooth sawfish. Each species is susceptible to entanglement based on their unique physical traits, but none more so than the sawfish since they generally swim along the

sea floor where marine debris can accumulate. Their toothed rostrum can easily become entangled in any garbage the sawfish encounters which can lead to injury, deformation, or even death from suffocation or starvation. Sawfish have



been photographed ensnared in a variety of items including dock lines, trap lines, ghost nets, fishing lines, pipes, coffee cans, dog toys, and elastic bands.

Scientists are becoming increasingly concerned about the growing number of endangered sawfish in Florida which are entangled in ball bungee cords believed to be from boathouse awnings. The plastic balls on these types of bungees are buoyant

enough to partially lift the device just off the bottom but not buoyant enough to float the whole cord to the surface. This results in lost or discarded bungees sitting upright on the bottom, where small sawfish can swim into the opening of the cords. The bungee then works its way down the body where it remains in place, slowly becoming more constrictive as the sawfish grows. It's imperative that we alert homeowners and boathouse awning companies to this escalating issue so that extra care can be taken during the assembly, removal, or repair of boathouse covers to keep these bungees out of the water to help protect endangered sawfish.

It is a shared responsibility of all outdoor enthusiasts to keep our waters free of trash and debris. Information about marine debris prevention is available at https://marinedebris.noaa.gov/. Next time you're on the water, stow all your gear and trash properly to prevent it from flying out of your boat and pick up any trash or debris you encounter. SITUATION

The Everglades Shores/Big Cypress Park Headquarters public drinking water system failed to perform compliance monitoring for the Primary Inorganic Contaminants Group (except Nitrate, and Nitrite) during the 2021 Calendar year. These are monitoring and reporting violations of Rule 62-550.513, Florida Administrative Code (F.A.C.)

IHEALTH EFFECTS

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not your drinking water meets health standards. We did not perform monitoring for the Primary Inorganic Contaminants Group (except Nitrate, and Nitrite) during the 2021 calendar year. Therefore we cannot be sure of the quality of your drinking water (with respect to these contaminants) during that time.

WHAT SHOULD CUSTOMERS DO?

With respect to these monitoring violations, **customers need not take any action**.

WHAT IS BEING DONE?

In order to verify the current quality of the drinking water with respect to the Primary Inorganic Contaminants identified in Table 1 of Rule 62-550, F.A.C., our water system now is required to collect samples for these contaminants as soon as possible, but by no later than January 31, 2022.

Lawn Watering Ordinance For All Everglades City Water Customers (Including Chokoloskee, Plantation, Copeland)

Everglades City Water Customers, there are new water ordinances in effect. Here are a few of the key rules. For the compete ordinance, contact City Hall.

- ♦ All customers existing landscape: No watering between the hours of 10:00 am and 4:00 pm.
- Those with an even numbered address: watering days are Tuesday, Thursday, and Sunday.
- ♦ Those with an odd numbered address: watering days are Monday, Wednesday, and Saturday.
- ♦ The ordinance also states that "wasteful and unnecessary water use is prohibited."

Beware of Online Scams By Kathy Brock

It is not new news that scammers want your money. What is new, is that their phishing campaigns are getting more and more sophisticated every day.

One email received by Elaine Middelstaedt shows how persistent the scammers are getting. It claims that it is from Norton Antivirus, showing a charge of \$294.86. The email it asks you to contact them by phone if anything is incorrect (please don't!).

The second email is much more difficult to discern as a scam because it is addressed to Kathleen Brock (me!) and includes my correct street address! In this email, it claims to be from Amazon.com stating it is charging me for Amazon Prime for a total of \$499!

Because it uses my name and address, and is not simply made out to "subscriber" it really caught my attention.

I Googled "Amazon Phishing" and saw that Amazon has a way to report these scammers. I provided the information as per their reporting site and forwarded the email to them as instructed on their website.

Here is what you need to look for BEFORE you click anything or call. Look at the address of the email. In this instance, it was clear it was not from Amazon...but everything else in the email was accurate! It is difficult to know how they obtained my email address, street address and full legal name, but they did.

Your best bet is to NEVER open these emails. When in doubt, contact the providers directly. Then report them to the fraud hotlines provided by our local sheriff's office: 239-252-2255 or 239-252-0069.

I'll always remember when I had a big part in the senior class play at Will Rogers High School in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Our drama teacher had coached us on just how we should stand, walk, sit, and speak. She even taught us how long we should wait after our cues before going on stage in order to make a dramatic entrance. Take a deep breath. Count to three. It's all in the timing, she insisted.

I've often thought about those words of advice through the years. She was right, you know. Having the correct timing when it comes to certain things sometimes makes life a little easier. It's like saying you're sorry. Oh, I know there are a lot of people who never admit to being wrong about anything. The word sorry just seems to stick in their throats. But, if it's not said now, when?

Never put off until tomorrow what you can do the day after. Many times, people let things fester and boil within them until they become so mad, for no apparent reason, they become totally unreasonable and out of control. That's when things can really get bad. If that person could just stop and take stock of their situation and accept some responsibility for creating that problem, it would help. "Rooted in Agriculture" explores farming and agricultural enterprises as the foundation of non-indigenous settlement in the Everglades. From the Union-controlled pioneer farms feeding the garrison at Ft. Taylor to vegetable picking and packing operations that grew to serve the nation, the story of the area's growth and development is synonymous with farming and food growing.

Event History of Everglades City March 17, 2022, 2:00 pm—3:00 pm

While many early settlers were attracted by the area's diverse and plentiful fish and game, it was the extraordinarily fertile soil that caused them to stay.

Squash, pumpkins, and cucumbers gave way to sugarcane and tomatoes — crops still grown throughout the region. Pioneer farms supplying soldiers in the Civil War would eventually grow into massive fields of tomatoes contributing 80% of the fast-food industry's supply nationwide. 1 bell pepper or 4 small, sweet peppers, chopped
1 jar of spaghetti sauce (I like Classico organic)
1 can of dark red kidney beans
(navy, pink, garbanzo, or northern will work too)
1 bag of extra wide egg noodles
Olive oil for cooking
Parmesan cheese to taste
Garlic powder or 1 tsp of fresh garlic
Black pepper to taste

My Little Slice of Paradise By Kathy Brock

Oh the drama! Last year I wrote happily about a nesting pair of osprey that chose a location right along the north side of the Barron River within easy viewing of my home (and that of my neighbors).

For at least 2 years prior, a pair of osprey tried to nest atop of the power pole...building what I will call a "flimsy" nest.

One year, the nest just kept falling apart as the birds tried to build. We (the neighborhood) surmised that they must have been a young, inexperienced pair. No chicks were hatched that year.

The following year, success came followed by tragedy as the birds built (another flimsy nest), the babies hatched, and then a storm came leaving the babies balancing on the power pole after the nest blew apart. Both fell to the ground, one survived and we brought it to the Von Arx Wildlife Center in Naples where it was rehabilitated and eventually released.

In late 2020, LCEC erected the aforementioned osprey tower ...we hoped the pair would choose it, and they did (at least we think it was "them"). The pair successfully raised three offspring. We were all so happy to finally have a drama-free osprey nesting season. Watching them feed the chicks. Then, watching the chicks practice flying at the nest, and then finally leaving with their parents on the big adult journey. We anxiously awaited 2022 to watch it all again...

In November 2021 the pair returned to the nest. They brought in more sticks, performed their in-air acrobatics, and very publicly demonstrated that they intended to raise a brood.

In late January, three osprey egg shells lie beneath the nest! We all waited to see the babies heads pop-up...and waited, and waited. Nothing.

Then, the cycle started all over again. More sticks, more aerial displays, and quite a bit more bird love was happening up on the tower. Wow, it was like Valentine's Day everyday for weeks!

We were hopeful...but it seems it was not meant to be. We don't know why they haven't produced chicks but we do know they tried (a lot)!

I also noticed that the great-horned owls abandoned their nest before raising a brood this year.

The owls chose the nest atop the old power station by Camellia Street Grill. I did not publish their location so they were not too bothered by us gawking humans until well into the nesting cycle.

Then, after about 8 weeks...they too have left the nest. More Everglades bird drama.

It's hard to know why this happens, and I am curious if there is at all any connection to the two failed nests? Is the weather off somehow or is this just a coincidence? It's probably the latter but I will be interested to read about the 2022 nesting statistics for other birds in our area.

I guess this year's "drama" is that there are no osprey on that big, beautiful tower (as of today).

Taxing Things by Mike "the tax guy" Klein **EXTENSION FOR FILING TAXES**

The IRS will grant a 6 month extension for income tax filing. This year (2022) the deadline for filing is April 18.

Individuals file Form 4868 for an automatic 6 month extension. Tax returns can then be filed during that period but no later than October 17th 2022.

proprietorships, Businesses: Sole partnerships, LLCs, and S corporations pay small business taxes using their owners' personal returns. To delay filing a business tax return, start by delaying your personal

Other business entities file Form 7004

The first part of IRS extension Form 7004 has you select the business tax return form you plan to file by the extended deadline. Choose the form that corresponds to your business type. Some of the most common ones are below.

Business type & Tax return form: C corporation -Form 1120 S corporation- Form 1120-S Partnership-Form 1065 Limited Liability Company- One of the above, depending on taxation status

C corp owners might need a accountant's help with filing for an extension.

It is important to keep in mind that an extension for file is not an extension to pay any taxes due. The IRS failure-to-pay penalty will run you 0.5% of your tax liability for every month your payment is late, up to 25%.

Farmers and Fishermen:

January 15-Pay your estimated tax for 2021 using Form 1040-ES. You have until April 18 to file your 2021 income tax return (Form 1040 Schedule F). If you do not pay your estimated tax by January 15, you must file your 2021 return and pay any tax due by March 1, 2022, to avoid an estimated tax penalty.

March 1-File your 2021 income tax return (Form 1040) and pay any tax due. However, you have until April 18 to file if you paid your 2021 estimated tax by January 15, 2021.
